





**DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

As we enter into this first week of Advent, we begin a new liturgical year in the Church and enter into a spiritual season that is well known as a time of preparation, expectation and awareness. As the scriptures suggest and as the time of Advent teaches, we should contemplate our relationships with the Lord. Are we ready to receive him as the tiny babe in the arms of his mother and as the judge of all things, living and dead, at the end of time? Do we have the same confidence and take the same comfort as we imagine him as a child wrapped in swaddling clothes and laid in the manger as we do when we imagine him coming in his full glory with all the angels to gather the just into his kingdom and condemn the unjust into eternal damnation? Do we, in the same fashion, welcome the warmth of his light as is made itself manifest through the star of Bethlehem on that cold night as we do the blazing glory of the son of justice on that last day when he will gather all true believers to himself?

As we finished Thanksgiving and begin the countdown toward Christmas with only so many shopping days left until the birthday of Christ Jesus, we hear the scriptures today which really inform us of the ultimate coming of the Son of God. In the reading from Isaiah God will "impose terms" and in the Gospel of Matthew God will, "pass judgment."

How do we deal with that polarity? It seems conflictual, somewhat disturbing, a bit distressing and may create some anxiety - that is - if you are a person who is totally of this world caught up in the trappings of our society and heavily influenced by the culture that surrounds us. It is not too hard to see it causing confusion and consternation if we are one who is only focused on celebrating the anniversary of Jesus' birth and the gift giving that goes on with that. However, we are reminded that we also must prepare ourselves for his ultimate coming with the same enthusiasm and excitement because when he comes again his promise will be fulfilled.

And so, is our rejoicing over those two faith realities (Nativity and Parousia) of the same quality and quantity? If not, then Advent is the season to make that adjustment. Its really a matter of perspective and it is a challenge to "look up" and "live up" to standards that are appropriate and expected of those who call themselves Christian.

In our lives, especially in this culture, we are so driven and we like things when they are on the straight and level. We like to see eye to eye in our personal relationships, our business, in our homes and even now in our church especially when we are in the archdiocesan pastoral planning process. Seemingly, what matters to most of us is where the rubber hits the road; the limit of what's the bottom line; and reality of the phrase, "what's in it for us?" It is the here and the now that seems to be the most important to us whereas, the hereafter doesn't cross our minds very much if at all.

The perspective that the scriptures offers is different as it invites us to not to adopt the straight and level nor the eye to eye perspective. Rather, it is the perspective of "looking up" and the "living up" to the greater expectations of God. The prophet Isaiah and the responsorial psalm (Ps 122) direct our attention from the worldly to the heavenly. In the that first reading, Isaiah speaks of the Lord's mountain and how all nations should stream toward it, "Come, let us climb the Lord's mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may instruct us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths." The responsorial psalm speaks of how we should go up to the house of the Lord and how all the tribes of the Lord "go up" to the heavenly city of Jerusalem.

The challenge is explicitly expressed in the second reading from St. Paul to the Romans, "to throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light...to conduct ourselves properly...to put on the Lord, Jesus Christ and make no provisions for the desires of the flesh." The challenge also comes through the gospel reading which speaks of a time of preparation, "for at an hour we do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

Looking up for heavenly instructions and Living up to Standards of Holiness, these are the pillars upon which living the Christian life is based. If we are truly responsive to that perspective and that challenge then our period of Advent should be a time of comfort and joy. If not, then I could imagine the fear and trepidation that rests in our hearts.



The Sharing Tree

St. Vincent de Paul Society is sponsoring the Sharing Tree to share Christmas gifts with those less fortunate. **Beginning November 22, the tree will be located in the main entrance of the Church and small trees at the side entrances.** Tags are the same as in the past with tags of various colors on the trees: PINK (girls), BLUE (boys), GOLD (food gift card from any grocery store), GREEN (family gift certificate from any store, restaurant, or family activity), WHITE (laundry basket with cleaning supplies and paper products), PURPLE (Resurrection nursing home residents—see back of tag for items). We ask that you spend between \$15 and \$25 for the gifts. Each child is given two articles of clothing and two toys. Please wrap your gifts and securely attach the tag to the **outside** of the gift. **DO NOT WRAP** the GOLD food gift cards—just put in a white envelope with the gold tag taped to the outside of the envelope. The food gift cards are distributed according to the size of the family. **Gifts must be returned to the tree by 10:00 AM on Sunday, December 14th.** Cash/check donations are also accepted and used throughout the year for help with food, utilities and rent. Thank you for your continued support.
