



DEAR PARISHIONERS,

One of the most enduring and endearing symbols of Christmas, outside of the Christmas Crèche, is the Christmas tree. The Christmas tree, whether natural or artificial, takes center stage in the house as family, relatives and friends gather during these festive days. Its evergreen boughs symbolize eternal life which is a gift to be thankful for only through the grace of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ who was born for our sake and who died for our sins.

The tradition of decorating a Christmas tree inside the house is relatively new only being in existence for about 200 years. However, there is a different tree that takes center stage in our readings for this weekend. And, this tree has been in existence for many more years. The tree to which I am referring is our family tree as Christian people. This tree not only has its fullness in Jesus Christ but its roots go far, far back to the dawn of creation. And today's readings teach us to, "Never forget your roots."

Today, through the prophet Isaiah, Jesus is referred to as a shoot that shall sprout from the "Stump of Jesse." Remember that Jesse was the father of King David. Unfortunately, though he was a strong and dynamic ruler, David was not the most perfect of kings. "The stump of Jesse" is referring to him. Jesus is mentioned as the shoot that shall sprout from the lineage of the Davidic kingdom.

Being mentioned as coming from the stump of Jesse is a matter of reference to the family tree. And, if you pay attention to the readings at the Vigil Mass on Christmas Eve (Mt 1:1-25) you will hear the account of the genealogy of Jesus traced all the way back through David to our father of faith, Abraham. In the third chapter of Luke, Jesus' roots are traced all the way back to the beginning of time with Adam.

Scriptures tell us that Jesus comes from a long, strong, dynamic but imperfect line of kings and prophets. However, as the prophet Isaiah continues, Jesus' kingdom and his prophecy will not be corrupt. It will be one of just judgment, faithfulness and peace. This passage from Isaiah is a poetic passage that paints a picture of what an ideal world would be like with Jesus.

In the gospel we hear of the rough and rugged John the Baptist who is also a prophet. In a not so poetic way, he proclaims repentance in order to prepare the way for the Lord and he confronts all the Pharisees and Sadducees that come to receive baptism. He demands of them to "produce good fruits" as evidence of their repentance. He then makes reference to trees. "Even now the ax lies at the root of the trees. Therefore, every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire."

On the one hand, John the Baptist is chastising the false prophets and the corrupt authority in his day and age. He proclaims that those who are in sin or are leading others into sin will be severely judged lest they repent. On the other hand, John the Baptist is proclaiming the fulfillment of all the prophets and the ultimate authority of Christ who is the Tree that produces the good fruit. Jesus is indeed, "That shoot that has sprouted from the stump of Jesse."

The message for us is obviously one of repentance. However, it might also serve us well during this time of Advent to reflect on our rootedness in Jesus Christ and our fruitfulness or the lack thereof for him. Fortunately, as a result of our baptism, we are included in God's family as adopted sons and daughters through Christ. We are connected to God through Jesus Christ as we are members of his family tree. However, the expectation of our being baptized also presents us with a challenge to live holy lives of service for God and others. We need repentance if we have cheapened our identity as Christians by sinning, corrupting others, being oppressive, and living selfishly.

When I went away to college and then to seminary, my family always reminded me to, "Never forget your roots." Meaning, "be thankful

for your background and upbringing, and be respectful to those who helped you get this far." Perhaps we need to hear that phrase again, "Don't forget your roots" and apply it to our faith in Jesus Christ, who came from a long line of nobility which, in itself, challenges us to live lives of nobility; of honor and of holiness.

Undoubtedly, as is mentioned in the scriptures and is part of our faith expression during Advent, Jesus will come again in his glory. He will come "from the top down" to judge the living and the dead. Even if we claim to be one of His descendants, will the axe that John the Baptist makes reference to in the gospel be aimed at us? Are we the foul and fruitless trees that will be chopped down?

We must remember and take to heart that he has already come to us from "the bottom up" as the "shoot that has sprouted from Stump of Jesse." He has already shown us how to live in this world so that we might be welcomed into the gates of heaven. He has already shown us the way of straightened paths and a leveled playing ground. Are we living accordingly? Have we, maybe, mismanaged our time, energy and efforts? Or worst of all, have we... forgotten...our roots?
