





**DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

I have to admit that through the course of my life, like anyone else, I have run the gamut of colorful human emotions. I have been angry enough to see “red.” I have had my experiences of having the “blues.” I have been “green” with envy. I haven’t always been as pure “white” as the driven snow. And, there have been occasions when I have been accused of being “yellow” in taking a stand against the “black” forces of evil. But I never ever have felt nor have I ever been told that I am pretty in “pink!” And actually, I would like to keep it that way.

This particular Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday. The priest and deacon wear the Rose-colored vestments and we light the Rose-colored candle in honor of this moment of our Advent journey. Gaudete literally means “Rejoice” and it is taken from the Latin translation of Philippians 4:4-5, “Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice! Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near.” It sets the tone of joyful expectation for the Lord’s birth and Second Coming, as does the permitted use of rose-colored vestments. We rejoice in anticipation of the coming of the light of the world as we are now half way through this liturgical season of preparation for Christmas.

The prophet Isaiah speaks very strongly about rejoicing as the Lord will come to transform the face of the Earth. He says, “The desert and the parched land will exult; the steppe will rejoice and bloom. They will bloom with abundant flowers and rejoice with joyful song.”

Even though it is Gaudete Sunday and Gaudete means “Rejoice”, I wonder if we shouldn’t rename this Sunday from “Gaudete Sunday” to “Get Out of the Way Sunday?”

In these few days we have left before Christmas and also during the time we have left before the Lord’s final coming we are, as St. James mentions, to patiently prepare for that day and become more a part of the transformations that takes place around us. We are not to complain but make clear the way of the Lord for his coming is imminent.

Obvious external transformations and preparations may have taken place these past weeks. Christmas trees, nativity scenes, colorful lights and beautiful ornaments decorate our homes. Store fronts and Christmas cards relay a message of good cheer and holiday happiness. Seasons greetings are conveyed through the voices of others whom we meet on the streets. We hear Christmas music piped through the sound systems in cars, offices and our places of business.

But, what about our internal transformations within? What about our hearts? Are our hearts ready for the coming of Christ who is the light of the world? Are our hearts being transformed and prepared? Are we really ready to rejoice in the Lord?

Sometimes the external transformations we see happening around us to do not always coincide with internal transformations that need to take place. With all the beautiful glitter and glimmering lights that surround us during this holy season, we still may have different shades of color and various emotions that obstruct our hearts. We still may not be able to rejoice in the Lord because something stands in our way. And that “something” may be our very self.

There are so many obstacles that get in our way of rejoicing in the Lord and some of those obstacles are of our own making. John the Baptist does us all a great service as he provides an example for all of us to follow. In the gospel we hear of John the Baptist while he is in prison. He has done all he could to prepare the way of the Lord but still yet he directs his followers to the person of Jesus. He gets out of the way and allows the Lord to take his rightful place in the hearts of his followers.

Our basic challenge as Christians during this “Gaudete Sunday” or “Get Out of the Way Sunday” is to remove or, at least, diminish the emotional obstacles that get in the way so that the Spirit of God can lead us to fulfillment in Christ. True rejoicing happens not when we put more lights on the house or get that last gift wrapped or card sent. True rejoicing happens when we allow the peaceful and powerful light of Jesus to reign in our hearts and homes.

What are the obstacles in your life as you prepare for Christmas and the final coming of Christ? What needs to get out of the way on this Gaudete Sunday? Do you need to get out of the way in order that others rejoice in the fullness of the Lord? Whatever

Resurrection Grant



◆ The light switch for the Chapel is on the right wall inside the Chapel doors. **Please do not bring food into the Chapel.**

◆ **Open the round tabernacle door on the actual tabernacle. If you are the only person in the chapel, upon completion of your visit close the round tabernacle door.**

◆ If you hear the tornado siren, please take the steps to the bottom and hide yourself in the opening under the stairs.

◆ Please be aware during these winter months that if there is a winter storm most likely the church will be locked and you will need to use the outside door.

Third Candle (Joy)

This candle, which is pink, signifies joy and rejoicing as Christmas draws nearer.

Fourth Candle (Love)

This candle represents love and the message of God's love announced by the angels at Christ's birth. It is purple.

Prayer and reflection: use the time for spiritual preparation, including prayer, reading scripture, setting up a prayer corner at home.
