



**DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

A friend of mine waited until the last minute to send out Christmas cards. She knew she had 49 folks on her list. So, she rushed into a store and bought a package of 50 cards without really looking at them. Still in a big hurry, she addressed the 49 and signed them without reading the message inside.

On Christmas Day when things had quieted down somewhat, she happened to come across the one leftover card and finally read the message she had sent to 49 of her friends. Much to her dismay, it read: *"This card is just to say. A little gift is on the way!"* Suddenly she realized that 49 of her friends were expecting a gift from her.

Here we are just a few days away from Christmas and that reality may have caught some of us by surprise and to many others it almost seems beyond belief. But, it is real. Now the pressure is on to prepare to get the house ready for guests; prepare the car for winter travel to extended family and old friends; prepare and get those last-minute gifts to share with loved ones.

In the midst of all of this we are reminded today to continue to prepare for the coming of Christ and the celebration of the anniversary of his birth among us as Emmanuel, a name that means, "God is with us." Have you given any thought as to what gift you will offer to him as that day approaches?

When we think of gift giving to Jesus around Christmas time we most likely associate it with the Three Wise Men or Magi as they traveled from afar bearing forth gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. However, we are blessed today to hear the story of a man who gave Jesus an even greater gift than these. We hear the story of Joseph and the great gift of his total and complete commitment to Jesus.

When we think of Joseph we really don't give him much consideration nor do we give him the credit that he deserves. He is often simply thought of as the doting and adoptive father of Jesus as well as the devoted and adoring husband of Mary. He is often considered as a common carpenter; a patient provider and the proverbial "third party" when it comes to Mary and Jesus. There is, indeed, a lot more to him than meets the eye and this week's gospel story gives us the opportunity to reflect upon him and the lessons we learn from him.

From what little we know about Joseph, we know for certain that he was a descendant of the house of David and that he was a holy and upright man (a "righteous man" as said in the gospel). Therefore, he has a long and strong connection to his Jewish faith as well as a deep faithfulness to the laws of God. If anything, Joseph was a holy and prayerful man who deliberated virtually everything within the context of his faith.

Thus, we have the setting of the gospel story wherein lies Joseph's prayerful discernment of his life direction. He finds himself in this baffling situation with so many mixed emotions betrothed to a young woman that is bearing forth a child not his own which is both perceived as probable baggage and/or a potential blessing. We hardly, if ever, give much attention to Joseph at this crossroad.

It appears, as the gospel relates, that Joseph had reached a definitive decision as he "decided to divorce her quietly." Who could blame him? But, we must remember that Joseph was a faithful and prayerful man. He was not one, like many of us, to make snap decisions; unjust judgments; say words he would later regret or do things that he wish he could later take back. Rather, he did something that we all need to consider doing when confronted with life altering decisions. **He slept on it.**

"Sleeping on it" is an idiom that we use when it refers to the process of important decision making. It speaks of withholding a definitive decision about a plan or idea and waiting until the next day in order to have some time to think more about it. In Joseph's case he really literally slept on it and in his dream, through divine intervention by the visitation of an angel, he truly discerned that it was God's will that he put this marriage at the forefront as well as dedicate the rest of his life in faithful service as a devoted husband of Mary and an adoptive father to Jesus.


