**DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

An outsider in a small Texas town around Christmas time, saw a “Nativity Scene” that showed great skill and talent had gone into creating it. But one small feature was all wrong: the three wise men were wearing firemen’s helmets. Totally unable to come up with a reason or explanation, he left. At a “Kwik Stop” on the edge of town, he asked the lady behind the counter about the helmets. She exploded into a rage, yelling, “You darn Yankees never read your Bibles!” The Outsider assured her that he did, but simply couldn’t recall anything about firemen in the Bible. She jerked her bible from beneath the counter and riffled through some pages, and finally jabbed her finger at a passage. Sticking it in the guy’s face she said with her deep southern Texas drawl, “See, it says right here, ‘The three wise men came from *afar* (mispronounced ‘a fire’).”

This is a great segue into speaking about the three wise men but instead of being concerned where they were coming from (a fire – afar) just where they were going makes more sense.

The joke and the actually scripture story help us focus on movements.

Twenty years ago, in 2005, the 20<sup>th</sup> annual World Youth Day was held in Cologne, Germany. The theme was, “We have come to Worship Him.” The Cathedral in Cologne is named the Epiphany – the Church of the Magi where, according to pious tradition, their relics are venerated.

In preparation for that gathering the youth were invited to reflect on various points.

1. **The notion of Journey or Pilgrimage.** Tens of thousands of young people came from tens of thousands of miles to gather in Cologne. Whether you come ten miles or ten blocks to Church it should be on a sense of pilgrimage rather than an obligation; or being dragged or forced to come.
2. **Bethlehem** which is a name translated as “House of Bread.” Jesus would later use the image of bread. “I am the bread of life; I am the bread which came down from heaven; the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.”
3. **The pilgrimage of World Youth Day to Cologne coincided with The Year of the Eucharist.** The youth were encourage to develop a devotion and practice frequent reception of the Blessed Sacrament. For us here during this holy season of Christmas, we know the child placed by Mary in the crib is the same Man-God we shall see nailed to the Cross. The same redeemer is present in the sacrament of the Eucharist. In the stable at Bethlehem Jesus allowed himself to be worshipped under the humble outward appearance of a newborn baby. On the altar at Mass and in the tabernacle the same Jesus lies in humble estate in the consecrated host and we adore him in the monstrance as he is really present body, blood, soul and divinity in the Eucharist. He offers himself to us as the food of eternal life.
4. **They fell down and worshipped him.** The Magi acknowledged him and worshipped him as the One awaited by the nations and foretold by the prophets. In Cologne, the youth were invited and encouraged to worship Him in the Eucharist and acknowledge him as our Creator, our only Lord and Savior. They were warned about the dangers of idolatry and other religious practices that are incompatible with the Christian faith. They were encouraged not to yield to false illusions and passing fads. They were cautioned about the seduction of wealth, consumerism and subtle violence. As they were warned, encouraged and cautioned...so are we. The youth respond well to quality worship; authentic hospitality and welcome; music that is energetic, enthusiastic: the proclamation of the word and good preaching that is clear, challenging and engaging. They also respond well to your presence and participation at Holy Mass. The **structure** of the Mass is a nonnegotiable but the **spirit** of the worship is in your hands.



5. **They opened their treasures and offered Him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.** Incense distinguished Jesus as the High Priest. Myrrh distinguished Jesus as the fulfillment of the Prophets who shed his blood. And, gold distinguished Jesus as the King of kings. Priest, Prophet and King are the three-fold gifts we receive at baptism. At Cologne the youth were reminded of their common baptism and their call to offer incense (fervent prayer and praise); myrrh (the outpouring of their affection and gratitude to Him) and gold (their freedom to follow him out of love). For us here, we are called to open our treasures not just in terms of our pocketbooks but our incense of prayer and praise; our myrrh of affection and thanksgiving; our gold – our freedom to follow him.

**They departed to their own country by another way. The three kings took a diversion of route.** The pilgrimage of the Youth to the World Youth Day in Cologne symbolized their encounter with Jesus and thus the conversion of heart to which all those who encounter Jesus are called in order to become the true worshippers that Jesus deserves. It is our collective call to be “living sacrifices of praise”. The Youth were charged with making courageous choices and heroic decisions as they were transformed by their experience and “went back a different way.” They are to be genuine witnesses for the new evangelization.

For us here, we are called to conversion of heart every time we encounter Jesus in the Eucharist and then depart “a different way” from worship. We are to be witnesses of our faith and evangelize near and **afar** while being **on fire** with the love of God through Jesus Christ.

## Gratitude and Hope in the New Year



As the Archdiocese of Dubuque continues its *Journey in Faith*, Archbishop Thomas Zinkula expresses sincere gratitude to all who have shared their hopes, concerns, and faith throughout this process.

The feedback received from parishioners across the Archdiocese is now guiding the next stage of discernment. Over the coming months, all input and parish data will be carefully reviewed. This spring, the final pastorate plan and clergy assignments will be shared.

Beginning in July 2026, each new pastorate will begin with an interim six-month Mass schedule while parishes work together to grow as communities of joyful missionary disciples, centered in the Eucharist and united in faith.
