



DEAR PARISHIONERS,

Steven R. Covey, was an American educator, author, businessman, and keynote speaker. His most popular book was *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People*. In another one of his books entitled, *First Things First, Principle-Centered Leadership* he gives this advice: "There always will be items on your "to do" list. The trick is to figure out which are priorities. You must first attend to what's both urgent and important. But to be truly effective you should spend as much time as possible doing important things that aren't urgent. Otherwise, you can spend all day *caught in the thick of thin things*."

The significance of this statement points out the fact that every once in a while, we need to sit back, re-evaluate our long to-do lists, and check for "thin things" that can be safely discarded in favor of activities that will have more lasting value. We need to do this because we don't always make the right choices, and too often we find ourselves engulfed in triviality, but then we sit back, think of thick and thin things, hit the reset button and try again.

In the gospel reading today we read of the prophet John the Baptist, accompanied by his many disciples. They are busy about their work of preaching repentance. They are "caught in the thick of thin things" when John caught sight of Jesus coming toward him. John said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world."

That proclamation "Behold" raises the eyes; directs the attention; and captures the hearts and minds of John's followers to seek out Jesus and eventually become his disciples. "Behold" is word that jars us out of the monotony of the present moment when we are mired down with tedious busyness and lose ourselves in this time and place. "Behold" seems to be an emphatic announcement of an exceptional presence in our midst. Although "Behold" may be a melodramatic and antiquated expression in our contemporary time, it is used forcefully and effectively in the scriptures.

We just came to the conclusion of the Christmas season. Please recall that silent and starry night in Bethlehem when, in the Gospel of Luke, the angel of the Lord appeared to the shepherd who were keeping the night watch over their flocks. The angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for **behold**, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all peoples. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord."

In this case the proclamation, "Behold" directs our attention to the birth of a baby - the newborn King who is both innocent and undefiled. Many of you who are parents can certainly appreciate the power of that experience when your newborn child comes forth from the womb. It truly is a moment in time to "behold" as you cooperated with natural law and God's desire to bring forth the gift of life. It is a miracle that makes manifest the presence of God in our midst.

In the "not too distant" future (about 10 weeks from now) we will enter into Holy Week beginning with Palm/Passion Sunday. We will hear again the proclamation of "Behold" but this time it is during the end of Jesus' life as he endures those moments of intense suffering. In the Gospel of John, after the scourging Pilate presents Jesus to the people wearing a crown of thorns and a purple cloak saying, "Behold the man!" And then, a little while later, Pilate said to the Jews, "Behold, your king!" before they crucify him.

In this case the proclamation, "Behold" directs our attention to the ultimate price that was paid for our redemption. On Good Friday as we "Behold" the wood of the cross on which hung the savior of the world, we come forth to venerate that symbol and consider the cost of his sacrifice. Any of us who have suffered in any way or grieved the loss of a loved one can certainly appreciate Jesus' suffering and His saving power. We can and do "Behold" the savior of the world.

But, what about the time in between Jesus' birth and death? How do we "behold" him between the cradle and the cross? We are so good about being attentive to Jesus during the high holy liturgical seasons of Christmas and Easter. How keep him at the center of our lives during the "Ordinary Time" when we find ourselves caught in the thick of thin things?

The words of John the Baptist in the gospel today, "Behold, the Lamb of God, behold Him who takes away the sins of the world" are the same words we hear at Holy Mass before we receive communion. We "behold" him most profoundly and significantly when we gather for Mass, hear his word and receive his divine presence in the Most Holy Eucharist. As John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him, so may

The Archdiocese of Dubuque continues to move forward with its *Journey in Faith* pastoral planning process. The feedback and data collected from parishes are now being reviewed carefully. This process of discernment will continue through the coming months, with the final pastorate plan and clergy assignments to be announced this spring.

In July 2026, each new pastorate will begin an interim six-month Mass schedule as parishes discern how best to collaborate and flourish as joyful missionary disciples, centered in the Eucharist and united in faith.
