



DEAR PARISHIONERS,

After five years of knowing each other hometown best friends, Brandy Hersh and Heidi Wickware, discovered they are actually full-blooded sisters. Only two years apart in age, these two women, from Springfield, MO, attended the same elementary and middle schools, but became best friends when they started dating two boys who introduced them to each other.

Although they have uncommon features, among them different eye and hair color, they were interested in and liked to do the same things. Sometimes they even finished each other's sentences. The two became fast friends and were closer than the other longtime friends they had had for years. It was as if they had a special connection... and, in fact, they did!

As it turns out their biological mother, Lisa Russell, got pregnant by her boyfriend with Brandy in 1980. However, they weren't married and Lisa couldn't afford to take care of the baby, so she gave Brandy up for adoption. Not long afterward, she married that same man who first got her pregnant and they had another child Heidi who, while growing up, had no idea that her mom had given birth to another child before her.

Eventually, through serendipity, Brandy met her biological mother through Heidi. After Lisa (the biological mother) found out Brandy's birthday and at which hospital she was born, she admitted that she had given up a child for adoption. Heidi went to Brandy and said, "Mom gave a baby up for adoption and she thinks it's you!"

Brandy informed her adoptive mother, Debbie Visio, who had some clues as to who the birth mother was at the time. Debbie gave Brandy the only clues that she had about Lisa and it was a match! Best friends actually turned out to be real sisters!

"That they may be one" are the words of Jesus' prayer in the Gospel of John "That they may be one - Ut Unum Sint" is also the title of an Encyclical letter written by the late Holy Father, John Paul II in 1995. It was a document written supporting the ongoing commitment of him and the entire Catholic Church regarding Ecumenism.

This past week, from January 18th through January 25th was recognized as the week of prayer for Christian Unity. The words of Jesus; the intentions of the Holy Father and the hope of this designated week of intentional prayer for Christian Unity remind all of us that we must make it our earnest and fervent prayer that the different Christian faiths may, some day, be fully reunited and that we may, one day, share at the same table together.

Despite some of our differences in theology or ecclesiology, we share in a common baptism and are united as one in the Lord through the waters of conversion and the shared responsibility of the great commission calling us all forth to discipleship.

The late Holy Father, in his encyclical letter, "Ut Unum Sint" recognized that among the many efforts of ecumenism, most notably the need for ongoing dialogue, are ecumenical activities that help to foster unity. In particular he mentions joint ecumenical prayer services and joint service opportunities.

John Paul II stated, (no.22) "Along the ecumenical path of unity, the pride of place certainly belongs to common prayer, the prayerful union of those who gather together around Christ himself. If Christians, despite their divisions, can grow ever more united in common prayer around Christ, they will grow in awareness of how little divides them in comparison to what unites them. If they meet more often and more regularly before Christ in prayer, they will be able to gain the courage to face all the painful human reality of their divisions, and they will find themselves together once more in that community of the Church which Christ constantly builds up in the Holy Spirit, in spite of all weaknesses and human limitations."

Regarding joint service as it reflects our baptism he stated, (no. 43) "Many Christians from all Communities, by reason of their faith, are jointly involved in bold projects aimed at changing the world by inculcating respect for the rights and needs of everyone, especially the poor, the lowly and the defenseless...In effect,

Since the divisions of the Reformation and the painful separations that followed involving anathemas, inquisitions and excommunications, we have certainly come along way. Even since Vatican II much has transpired which denotes progress in the relationships between Christians of different denominations. The Holy Father stated (no.42), "It happens for example that, in the spirit of the Sermon on the Mount, Christians of one confession no longer consider other Christians as enemies or strangers but see them as brothers and sisters."

At the end of this week which was dedicated as "Prayer for Christian Unity" we remember our history which was, at times, dark and painful; we renew our commitment to prayer as we are inspired by the words of Jesus, "That all may be one," and we must reinvigorate our efforts to have ecumenical dialogue and fruitful discourse.

Guided by the feedback received from parishioners across the Archdiocese, the Core Team is now reviewing input and parish data to prepare recommendations for Archbishop Thomas Zinkula. The final pastorate plan and priest assignments will be announced this spring.

Beginning in July 2026, each new pastorate will begin with an interim six-month Mass schedule as parishes prayerfully discern how to work together in mission, unity, and love. The Archdiocese is also developing resources to help with parish collaboration, evangelization, and renewal.
