

Are you all aware of the phenomenon known as “Flash Mobs?” A flash mob is a group of people who assemble suddenly in a public place, perform an unusual and sometimes pointless act for a brief period of time and then disperse just as quickly as if nothing happened at all. This behavior produces an eye opening and, sometimes, awe inspiring reaction from those unsuspecting onlookers who were not privy to this prearranged activity.

A “Flash Mob” is a relatively new social phenomenon that obviously does have an impact on crowd behavior and crowd mentality (for better or for worse). Among the various social – psychological dimensions that it brings forth, the one that I would like to call to the forefront is called “**de-individuation**” which means that individuals who participate with or who are exposed to such a group tend to adopt a “group mind” whereby they tend to become more focused on the group goal and less on their own individual interests.

This is the end of Catholic Schools Week and I would like to zero in on “**de-individuation**” as I continue to speak with you about the scriptures and promote our Catholic School system.

In the first reading from the prophet Zephaniah I was struck by the line which read, “But I will leave as a remnant in your midst a people humble and lowly, who shall take refuge in the name of the Lord; the remnant of Israel.” In a world that is becoming increasingly shallow and self absorbed we seem to be losing our center which should be on God and the universality of our faith in Christ. The message of Zephaniah seems to be as pertinent today as it was so many years ago as people wandered away from their relationship with God.

In the second reading from Paul’s letter to the Corinthians I was drawn to the first sentence, “Consider your own calling, brothers and sisters.” Paul invites the Corinthians to reflect on their history and own up to the fact that God has called them in faith to confound the strong, the arrogant and the well to do by living out the ways of the Lord. It is humility in service that brings down the proud hearted. The truth about considering our own calling is that it is to be faith based rather than dictated by human standards so that if we ever boast, we boast in the Lord.

And then is the gospel reading from Matthew regarding the “core curriculum” or essential teachings of Jesus through the beatitudes. When Jesus went up the mountain and began to teach his disciples he instilled within them not only a sense of enduring hope but also a desire to be more and give more toward the kingdom of heaven and to do so with a joyful heart.

We are blessed to have a Catholic School. Indeed, there are so many positive elements and outstanding statistic regarding Catholic Education. At the same time, we are also blessed to have a very good public-school system in Iowa in general and in Dubuque specifically.

The distinction between the two primarily rests upon the fact that our Catholic school provides a “faith based” approach to education and human formation in which the students, on a daily basis, are exposed to, instructed on and infused with the message of Jesus Christ through the teachings of the Catholic Church. Every day these students are instructed in the classroom or taught by an example to maintain and strengthen their faith so as remain as an integral part of that “remnant” (a people humble and lowly who seek refuge in the Lord) that Zephaniah spoke about in the first reading.

Also, in the words of St. Paul, everyday the students are to “Consider their calling” not to succumb to human standards but to serve in humility and boast only in the Lord. And finally, every day these students are in an environment of prayer and fellowship that

This approach is solidly based on the teachings of Jesus when he preaches on the kingdom of God and when we learn the rule of life presented to us through Scripture.

When trying to compare private to public schools especially here in Iowa – that is the difference, that is the distinction, that is the gift of Catholic Schools.

In the midst of trudging along in life and trying to maintain the human standards we set for ourselves which often lead to undue stress and anxiety, we need to be reminded of God’s standards which are truly designed to lead us to freedom and peace. We find that reminder in the purpose Catholic education. Sometimes it is subtle and at other times it is obvious. But, at all times it is powerful, it is essential and it must be appreciated.

While not every perspective can be reflected in every final decision, the Archdiocese is committed to walking with every parish and their parishioners through the transition from what has been to what is emerging. We trust that God is leading us — even through moments of loss — toward new life and renewed strength.

Through listening, discerning, and praying, we are walking together in faith, trusting that the Spirit is guiding us toward a hopeful future for the Church in northeast Iowa.
