



**DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

This is the first Sunday of Lent and one of the major thrusts during the Lenten season is for us to recognize our sinfulness and seek repentance. It is a time for us to seriously review our humanness in relationship with Jesus Christ; recognize those obstacles that hinder us within that relationship and rid ourselves of those impediments that keep us from traveling on the high way of faith and morals. Its time to confront the age-old excuse, "I'm only human" when it comes to our spiritual battle for holiness.

It is also a good time to talk about evil and the "devil" which does exist and manifests itself through different means and in various forms. Although we have a tendency to avoid the subject and want to remain silent about it, Evil is very much present and very powerful. Evil exists outside of us as it has influence over nations, societies and institutions. The presence of Evil threatens the sanctity of life and the security of our liberties. Even our church isn't immune to evil as is evident through some of our history and surfaces at times still today.

Evil also dwells within us as it affects us personally. Vices, addictions, attitudes and distractions in our human hearts all lead us away from what is good and peaceful, honest and true. Evil has woven itself into the very fabric of our human condition and has proved to be a great hindrance to us on our path to holiness.

In the book of Genesis and within the account of Creation, after God creates the world and everything that dwells within God declares it as "Good." Humanity was created in the image and likeness of God and it started out as "Very Good." In that relationship there existed a special union, a unique interdependency and a state of complete grace.

In the first reading we learn about the fall of humanity from that place of Goodness, the fall from that state of Grace. Evil enters into the picture as it comes forth from the human heart. Symbolically, it comes in the form of a serpent and convincingly says, "You certainly will not die! No, God knows well that the moment you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods who know what is good and what is evil."

It is true that when the man and woman eat of the forbidden fruit, they do not die, yet they become subject to death and will eventually die. It is true that their eyes are opened, but not in the way they anticipated. They are now aware, as they were not before, of a whole new area of human experience, the experience of guilt and shame. They know they are naked. Now distant from God, Humanity makes its own decisions as to what is best for itself but it makes these decisions without the breadth and depth of God's wisdom and vision.

We do have the ability to recognize the presence of evil in its obvious and blatant forms. We strongly react, albeit often too late, to atrocities or terrorism, genocide, hunger, homelessness, abuse and neglect. We consider these as substantial and serious forms of evil. They are crimes against humanity. These incredible acts of destruction are simply considered inhumane and should not be tolerated but what do we do about it?

Unfortunately, we have a poor ability to recognize the presence of evil in its more subtle and softer tones. We do not strongly react to immorality, infidelity, lewd and inappropriate conduct and attitudes that are unbecoming of our Catholic identity. Sometimes we even refuse to feel guilt and shame over these things. For some reason we do not consider these as evil or destructive. For some reason we politely dismiss these actions and begin to tolerate them as they just seem to figure into our human condition, I mean, after all, we are "Only Human" thinking that these sins are justified by using that excuse.

We do not have to live this way, in a state of Sin. We do not always have to succumb to lustful desires of the flesh and greedy passions of the human heart. We do not have to resign ourselves to the excuse that we are "only human." We are better than that because we have been redeemed in Jesus Christ.

As the second reading from St. Paul to the Romans suggests, in and through the humanity and divinity of Jesus Christ, that we have been redeemed and restored to that status of grace. Although we are still subjected to sin, we are no longer

Stations of the Cross: Fridays at 5:30 pm. Feb. 27, March 6, 13, 20, 27, Good Friday, April 3, Noon.

Rite of Election: The second step in Christian Initiation is the liturgical rite called election. This closes the period of the catechumenate. The celebration of the rite of election, which usually coincides with the opening of Lent, also marks the beginning of the period of final, more intense preparation for the sacraments of initiation, during which the elect will be encouraged to follow Christ with greater generosity. Clairra will be sent from the Church of the Resurrection to the Rite of Election held at the Cathedral on Sunday, February 22, 2026. Clairra will meet Archbishop Zinkula.

First scrutiny – March 8 – 3rd Sunday in Lent

Scrutinies are rites of self-searching and repentance. When people from another spiritual background seek baptism in the Catholic Church, they do so by stages. Three times during Lent the church prays the Scrutinies to encourage a spirit of repentance among those who seek a worthy celebration of Baptism.

Presentations of the Apostles Creed March 10, 5:30 PM Mass

The Elect are given the Apostles Creed after the first scrutiny. These texts are presented in order to enlighten the elect. The Creed, as it recalls the wonderful deeds of God's salvation of the human race, suffuses the vision of the elect with the sure light of faith.

Marriage Validation: If you were married civilly but not married in the Church and you would like your Marriage blessed in the Church please contact Deacon Mike.
