



**DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

Brothers and Sisters: Whoever is in Christ is a new creation.

A woman steps in front of a bus and dies instantly. She finds herself at the pearly gates, being greeted by God himself. He looks the woman up and down, and says "Hm... Strange. It's not your time! I'm sending you back." "Sending me back? How long until it IS my time?" she asks. "Worry not, my child. You have many, many more years until it is your time. You will live until the ripe old age of 108!"

She's sent back to Earth and pops into her same mangled but now miraculously repaired body. She gets up, dusts herself off, and with a huge smile on her face immediately heads to the plastic surgeon. She proceeds to get a face lift, a tummy tuck, hair implants and more. "If I'm going to live to the old age of 108, I might as well look my best!" she happily thought.

After all the surgeries and cosmetic procedures and makeovers, she looks STUNNING. Beautiful pouty lips and a tiny waist and long luscious hair. She walks out of the salon and BAM. She's hit by a bus and dies instantly. Once again, she is at the pearly gates and again, is greeted by God. "What in the world was that?!" she exclaims, "You said I was supposed to live until 108!"

God looks her up and down and says "Well, I didn't recognize you!"

The basic message and movement of the scripture readings this weekend focus on the notion of "Transformation."

In the first reading we witness the calling of Abram to go forth from the land of his kin-folk and become what he was destined to be as the "Father of our Faith." Henceforth, he was transformed and that transformation is signified by the changing of his name from Abram to Abraham.

In the gospel we have a "Mountaintop Experience" wherein the three disciples give witness to the "Transfiguration" of Jesus. The three disciples who had trekked up there with Jesus were amazed, utterly wowed by what they saw when Jesus become dazzlingly white and conferred with Moses and Elijah (who represent the law and the prophets).

You would think that they would be fully transformed after that experience but something was wrong as they wanted to "stay in the moment" by offering to erect tents to stay there on the mountain and avoid making the essential journey to Jerusalem. They were still not thinking as God thinks but as human beings do by resisting the invitation to embrace the whole experience.

They were waffling, second guessing and afraid to pursue this call to further holiness. They began to snap out of it when they heard the voice of God command that they listen to His beloved Son. They were also given assurance from the gentle touch and soothing voice of Jesus that said, "Rise and do not be afraid."

Lent is a time for transformation in us. It is a time to let our way of thinking be transfigured so that we may think like God thinks and not how we think as human beings. What saves the disciples from their un-transfigured way of thinking is the voice of God speaking from heaven, telling them to listen to Jesus. What also saved them was the gentle touch and the soothing voice of Jesus telling them to "Rise and do not be afraid."

Most of us do not have the benefit of such an audible voice, but we do have the example of those three disciples with which scriptures presents us. We can listen to Jesus through the voice of the Church and the words of scripture. We can have those mountaintop experiences; feel his gentle touch and hear his soothing voice through the voices of others that tell us not to be afraid.

Lent is traditionally understood as a time of giving things up. Today's gospel suggests that we need to give up certain old ways of thinking and listen to Jesus. Our Lenten discipline should not only be one of giving up sweets, smoking or swearing, but one of actively listening to Jesus in prayerful reflection.

- ◆ **The outside door by the side of Church will be unlocked daily from 5:00 am – 6:00 pm. After 6:00 pm the door can be unlocked by using the security key pad to the left of the door on the outside wall. For the code password, call Deacon Mike in the parish office, 556-7511.**
- ◆ The light switch for the Chapel is on the right wall inside the Chapel doors. **Please do not bring food into the Chapel.**
- ◆ **Open the round tabernacle door on the actual tabernacle. If you are the only person in the chapel, upon completion of your visit close the round tabernacle door.**

- ◆ Please be aware during these winter months that if there is a winter storm most likely the church will be locked and you will need to use the outside door.
