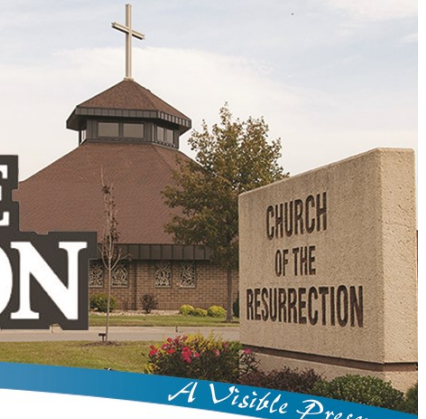

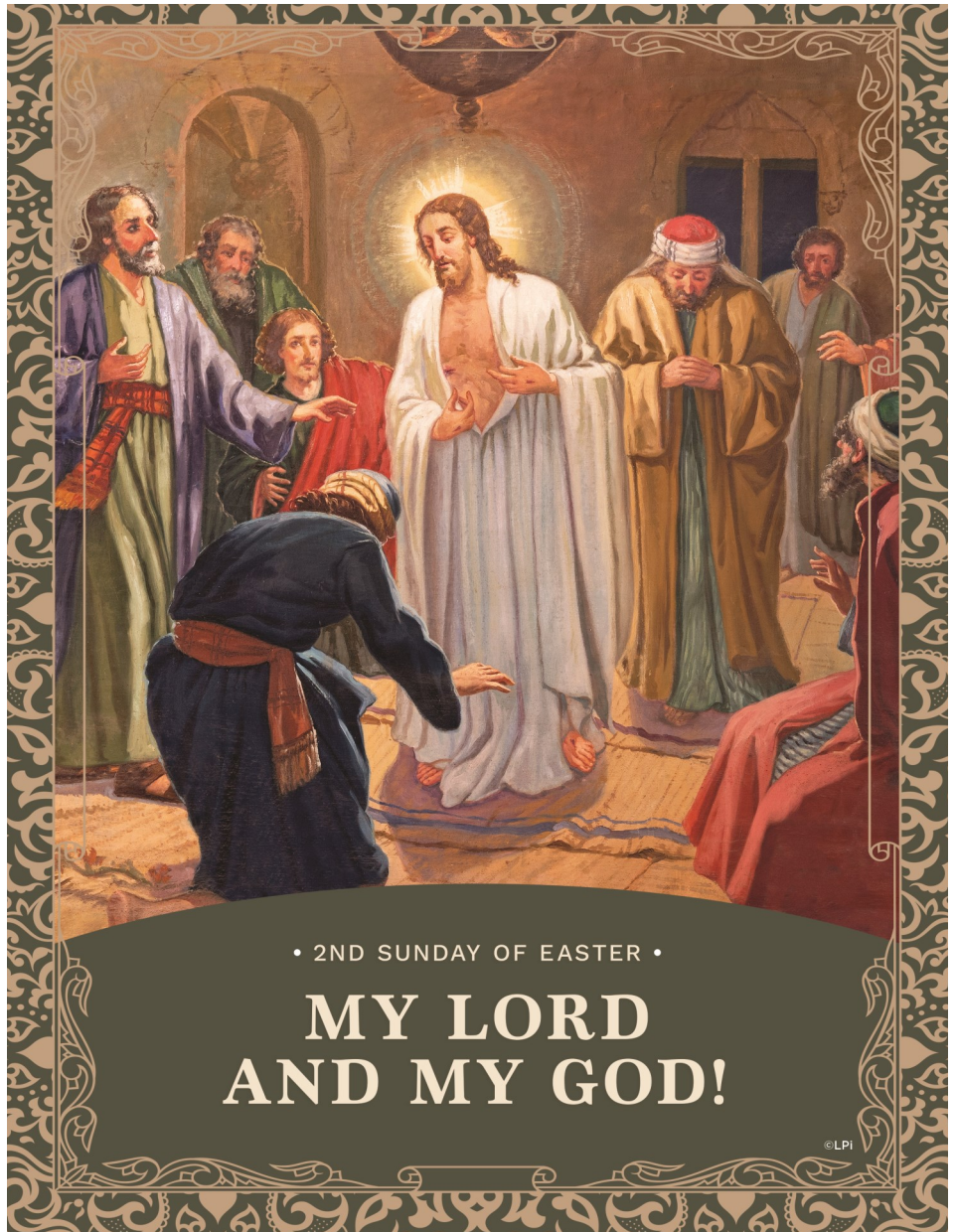

“It’s hard to believe”, is a phrase we might often use in the course of conversation especially when we encounter confounding things, an unexpected turn of events or a surprising development. You might hear that phrase now and again when grandma shows up at the door and takes note of how much you have grown since last Mother’s Day. It might work its way into conversation when grandpa tells you about that great big fish he caught up at the lake over the summer. It might resound in the excited gasps of your mother, sisters and aunts when you show them your engagement ring. It might be an expression on your face when your wife tells you that you are going to be a father...of twins...Aaahh!!! “It’s hard to believe...but it’s true!”

It is also a phrase that works its way into the deep recesses of our minds, into the chambers of our hearts and the within folds of our guts when it comes to matters of faith and belief. As we are surrounded by a culture that preaches unlimited individual freedom over and above communal responsibilities and having been formed in a society that promotes relativism, personal gain and social status makes it hard to believe.

Encountering people, including some friends or family, that claim to be Catholic or Christian who get away with living a contradicting lifestyle that is either hedonistic or hypocritical makes it hard to believe. Becoming swallowed up or swayed by television programming that emphasize and then capitalizes on human emotions rather than on good common-sense logic makes it hard to believe. It is no wonder why so many people struggle and persist in their unbelief.

Nevertheless, in the midst of the hardships and heartaches, in spite of being confronted by corruption or confusion there still remains a deep and abiding presence within that provides consolation and is a source of hope. There is the gift of faith that, according to the first letter of Peter, is “more precious than gold that has been tested in fire.” And sometimes, even with the gift of faith it is hard to believe...but it’s true.

The scripture readings for this weekend focus on belief or unbelief, questions, doubts, fear and faith. In the gospel from John we have Thomas who, despite the predictions and pronouncements of Jesus who said clearly that he must die and be raised up again, has persisted in his unbelief. Even given the testimony of the other apostles he still needs verification from Jesus who provides His real presence and invites him to probe his wounds. Yes, Thomas it is hard to believe...but it’s true.” “Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed.”

Faith is a gift and like many people have told me, “I can’t imagine life without it.” Faith helps us see through the darkness of doubt; it helps us endure the pain of separation; it guides us on the way through the wilderness of this world to the bright lights of the city of God. We must have faith in the Risen Christ. We must have faith in His real and abiding presence. We must have faith in the Eucharist.

Earlier in John’s Gospel, in chapter 6 Jesus explains that he is the bread of life and that we should eat of his flesh and drink of his blood so that we may have eternal life. At that time many of his disciples found this “hard to believe” as verse 60 reads, “This saying is hard; who can accept it?” Many of his disciples, for lack of faith, could not and would not believe. They walked away returning to their former way of life. Still to this day many Catholics, for lack of faith, do not believe in the Real Presence. According to a 2022 survey by CARA (Center for Applied Research Apostolate in Georgetown University) almost two-thirds of Catholics believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, but only 17 percent of adult Catholics physically attend Mass at least once per week. That is a sad reality. Yes, I know...it’s hard to believe...but it’s true.

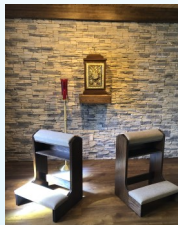

The challenge it poses to us is that of making the living presence of Christ that dwells within each one of us more alive in the world through our own acts of holiness and service.

We must come to church more frequently and receive the Eucharist more faithfully! In doing so we encounter our living and true God. We should approach the Eucharist and, with humility, recite the words of St. Thomas as he inspires us to say, "My Lord and My God." At the same time, we must embrace the reality that Jesus continues his mission through us. Yes, I know...sometimes it's hard to believe...but it's true.
