In a Christ-centered environment, St. Thomas empowers young people to build their personal foundation for lifelong learning, leadership and service to others.


NEW STAFF SPOTLIGHTS:

To gain an awareness of the Caldecott medal and qualities of a good picture book. To practice reading for deep meaning and the subtleties of literature.


To clearly express ideas and opinions with peers.

To listen to and evaluate the ideas of others.

To integrate cross curricular skills such as math.

To build excitement about authors and new literature.

The event will include each classroom being introduced to the purpose of the Caldecott Award and the elements judges look at when choosing the winner, reading all of the books that are nominated for the award this year and then voting on which book they think should win the award. In order to do this we need to order approximately 20 picture books. These books are the books that are nominated for this year's Caldecott Award. We have plans to house these books each year in the Bob and Marty Doerning Library after we are finished with them. RaiseRight/Scrip: Simply a gift card program.

BUY GIFT CARDS: Select from over 750 popular brands, with options for eGift cards (available immediately) physical gift cards, and reloadable gift cards. No extra money spent. No wasted value. You pay \$50 for a \$50 gift card. Use to pay for your purchases or give as a gift.

EARN FUNDS: For every gift card purchased, you receive earnings up to 20%. The earnings come from the gift card brand you are purchasing - their way of supporting organizations like ours. Average earnings are 6% (much more than the average credit card rewards program)

EARNINGS DISTRIBUTION: All earnings for our organization are tracked and online reports are available. Currently, 50% of the earnings are available to use as a credit on tuition accounts and will be applied annually.

Start earning today! Download the RaiseRight mobile app and enter our enrollment code to join. 12LB436F3119 Buy cards and when you are ready to check out, sign up for secure online payments. You can link a bank account, add a credit card, or both. eGift cards are delivered to the app within minutes - view them in your wallet. Physical gift cards are mailed to our coordinator and will be delivered to you. Local businesses also participate and those can be ordered via forms available in the church and school office. Children's Rosary: Simply praying the rosary led by children.

To qualify for the Danuta & Kent Oberg Children's Rosary Scholarship, you need to be a student at St. Thomas Aquinas School and attend scheduled Children's Rosary sessions which are offered 2x/month from September through May. More scholarship dollars are allocated to faithful attendees which require attending seven times in the nine-month period in which sessions are offered a total of eighteen times. Sessions are scheduled on the 2nd Sunday of each month at 10:00 AM just before the 10:30 AM Mass and on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 6:00 PM at St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church.
