










Come join STA students and staff for weekly Stations of the Cross. The greatest act of love from Jesus started with His walk.



"Just a note from Teacher Joylyn Cobb" — I oversee the FAST assessment testing and the results review for STA students. The goal for each child is to achieve the designated benchmark and as a school, the goal is to achieve 80% proficiency. Our goal is to be transparent about our school and what we are doing to try to improve our scores. We have set high goals and in order to reach these goals we need to be transparent and also get everyone on board to help. That includes home support. Here are three strategies currently in place:


- *Providing small group instruction during MTSS time to work on areas where our data tells us the students are below benchmark.
- *Purchased and putting into use Heggerty and 95% phonemic awareness and phonics programs to use with students who haven't met benchmark or are hovering just above benchmark.
- *Daily at home monitored reading expectations: K-10 minutes, 1st- 10 minutes, 2nd- 15 minutes, 3rd- 15 minutes, 4th- 20 minutes, 5th- 20 minutes, 6th- 20 minutes.

"Kinder Updates from Teacher Katie Nyren" — Kindergartners work very hard every day on their core subjects; those we know are so important for development and learning. However, we start off every single day with a special prayer song where we ask Jesus to nourish our day of learning and adventure, and keep us safe and well. We pray to Mary displayed in our classroom or to the steeple of the church from our window view. Core learning is so important to our kids, but so is their spiritual well-being. I love getting to provide both with my students. After prayer, we pledge the flag and begin our core learning blocks. We are able to implement religion all throughout our day at St Thomas, and I know that helps my kindergarten class thrive.

Kindergartners are loving Math this time of year! They have mastered their standards so we get to implement some higher order thinking skills. This includes scales! This allows us to better analyze various attributes and teach the kids to do the same in the world around them. We used toys and our teddy bear counters to learn about balancing a scale and trying to hypothesize which items were similar in weight. The students loved this so much, they had trouble staying seated during our math meeting! If you don't already have a balance scale at home, I highly recommend it as a very engaging learning tool for kids. The students have also spent some time learning shapes. Trapezoid, parallelogram, rhombus, can be big math words to kindergarteners. However, they're doing so great with our shapes portion of learning! It is another way to create more analytical skills, two trapezoids can make a hexagon, and so on. The kids love "playing" (aka learning) with our pattern blocks! They're learning to identify many shapes in the world around us and what they can make with those shapes. This helps nurture analytical thinking, which creates many more connected thoughts and questions from kids this age. The bonus is, it shows me what they understand and they have fun!
