

"More tidbits from Principal Theresa Schleisman" - About Educational Savings Account (ESA):

The Students First Act, introduced into law in January, makes state funding available to support the success of every K-12 student in Iowa. This bill establishes a framework and funding for education savings accounts (ESA), which may be used by eligible families to cover tuition, fees and other qualified education expenses at accredited private schools in Iowa.

This law gives parents choice in education and supports this choice financially. St. Thomas Aquinas School, like all Catholic Schools across Iowa, is excited to welcome new students and families into our school. With this exciting change, we anticipate an increase in enrollment – specifically within the next 3 years. We ask for your prayers regarding this blessed opportunity to share our faith with more students and positively impact them in mind, body, and spirit.


