

Greetings on this Palm Sunday!

We enter into Holy Week and try to observe these days with greater reflection on all that Jesus suffered and shed for our salvation.

I am very thankful for all of your generosity which enabled the purchasing of our Easter flower arrangements and the beauty that will be shared as we welcome Easter Sunday. As well, I am truly grateful to all of the volunteers who freshened up the church interior in anticipation of these most solemn days. My thanks and appreciation also to the hands and help given to prepare the sanctuary as we anticipate the special moments of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil.

Good Friday is a very important moment for the support of the Holy Land. Please remember to share what you can at the 3 p.m. Passion service with the special collection taken up for the shrines and sites of Jerusalem, Bethlehem and surroundings.

Our fasting returns on Good Friday. Those who are 14 years of age and older are asked to abstain from meat. Those who are 18 to 59 years of age are asked to fast, having only one meal, along with two other moments of eating, which do not add up to a second meal.





Action Needed: Ask Governor Murphy to Increase Funding for Chapter 192


Chapter 192 (Compensatory Education) provides remedial instruction in Reading, Language Arts, and Mathematics for students in nonpublic schools. The per-pupil amount of \$995.33 for these services has not been increased since the 2008-2009 school year, while the amount of time provided for the service has been decreased as a result of costs incurred by the providers of the service. Please contact Governor Murphy and ask that he increase the per-pupil amount for Chapter 192 to \$1,300.00 per service so that eligible students can get the services they need to be successful in school. If you have a personal story regarding this issue, please add that to the message.



HOLY WEEK COMPANION: JESUS HIMSELF


1 week to Easter: We travel with Jesus


Our greatest example and Lenten companion is Jesus. Today begins Holy Week, the holiest days of the liturgical year. On Holy Thursday Jesus will be our example of how to serve one another. He washed the feet of his disciples and gave us himself in the bread and wine. He taught us that whatever he did, he wanted us to do. "Do this in memory of me," he said.

On Good Friday Jesus suffered and died for us. He gave us this example because he knew that there would be times when we would have to suffer and die in little ways so that others could live better lives. Have you ever given up a toy? Have you stayed with a friend and given up your recess time? Have you eaten small meals or given up junk food and donated the money you saved so that others could have food to eat? These are ways of dying to ourselves so that someone else

On Holy Saturday Jesus remained in the tomb. He taught us two things: death is not the end, and our trust in God is always rewarded. Even though it is sad to lose people we love we believe Jesus' promise. If we live as Jesus taught us, we will also rise with him on the last day. Even when his life was difficult, Jesus always put his trust in God. When our lives are hard we must always believe God is with us. God will give us the strength and courage to endure hard times. God will give us new life and we will live with God forever.

alm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week. The day recalls Jesus' triumphal entry into the city of our salvation that takes place about a week before his Resurrection (Easter).

Why do we wave palms?

When Jesus rode into Jerusalem, crowds greeted him by waving palms and covering his path with small branches. We wave palms today to hail Christ in his triumph for our salvation in the light of his Paschal Mystery - his Passion, Death and Resurrection

On Palm Sunday, priests will wear red vestments n keeping with focus on the Lord's glorious Passion



Jesus enters Jerusalem. The crowd of disciples accompanies him in festive mood, their garments are stretched out before him, there is talk of the miracles he has accomplished, and loud praises are heard:

"Blessed is the King who Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!'
