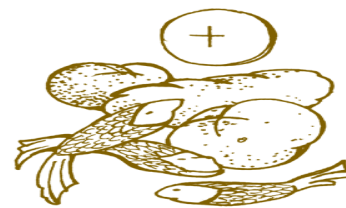

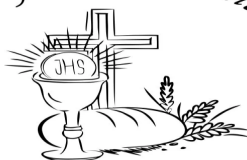

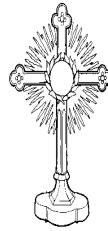
Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

Effective this upcoming Easter season, the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord will be permanently transferred from Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter to the following Sunday, the Seventh Sunday of Easter, in all Catholic dioceses in New Jersey. This year, the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord will be observed on Sunday, May 29. This liturgical observance is an integral dimension of the completion of Our Lord's paschal mystery and after much discussion, the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey collectively discerned that the transferring the observance to the following Sunday would allow for greater participation among the faithful.



From April to August 2022, the relics of Saint Bernadette will tour the United States for the first time, bringing the grace of Lourdes to parishes across the country. The Sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes is organizing the pilgrimage of the relics in partnership with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, North American Volunteers, Hospitalité of Miami and the Order of Malta. The Relics of Saint Bernadette will visit the Diocese of Metuchen, the only diocesan stop in New Jersey, from May 17-20, 2022.

We are almost at the end of the 2021-2022 religious education program year. Thankfully, we were able to return to in-person classes and our students and catechists were happy to see each other.

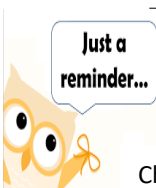

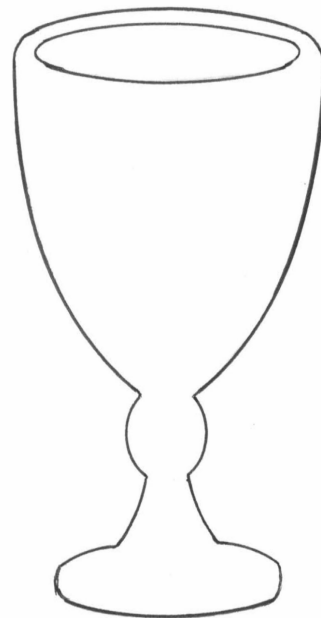
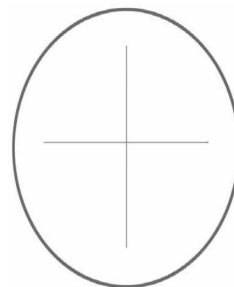
FEED MY LAMBS

Today's Gospel (John 21:1-19) tells the story of the time after the Resurrection when Jesus helped the apostles catch a large net full of fish. They didn't recognize him until they pulled in a catch so large they could hardly handle it. Afterward, on the shore, Jesus prepared a breakfast for them of bread and some of the fish they had caught. When they ate this meal, they realized that Jesus really was with them. Do you remember another time when Jesus fed many people with loaves of bread and fish (John 6:1-14)? Do you remember a time when Jesus shared a meal of bread and wine with his friends (Luke 22:7-20)?

This is the time of year when many parishes celebrate First Holy Communion. Children are preparing to receive Jesus for the first time and share in the Eucharistic meal. They remind us how important it is always to be prepared and desire to receive Jesus. Once we have received Jesus we cannot keep him to ourselves. Jesus reminds us that we must continue to bring him to others. Do you know anyone who will be making their First Communion this year? Are you one of those children?

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (#1391-1397) tells us that each time we receive Holy Communion "fruits," or wonderful things, happen. Most importantly, we grow closer to Jesus. Our venial sins are forgiven and we are strengthened to resist mortal sin. Finally, the people of our Church become more firmly united in doing Christ's work of serving the poor.
