With the Feast of Christ the King on November 19, 2022, our parish will be renewing the commitment of those who are in our various ministries

Also at this time of the year, an invitation is extended to our wider parish family to consider participating in one of the ministries helping with prayer, charity and community life.

A sign up table will be located in the church foyer for the following Ministries:

1.) Lectors proclaim the readings of the Word of God, once a month, at Sunday Mass. They are also asked to attend Formation meetings which help to refresh their spiritual lives. These meetings are held every three months.

2.) To serve as an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist (EME) is to distribute the sacrament of Holy Communion at Sunday Mass. To review this special service, EMEs also attend Formation sessions which are held every three months.

3.) Ushers greet incoming parishioners and serve at Sunday Mass twice a month. They also attend Formation sessions once every three months to grow in this ministry of hospitality and gathering.

4.) To serve as choir member is to sing weekly with our 10:30 a.m. celebration. Choir members attend weekly practice which starts one hour prior to the start of Sunday Mass.

5.) To serve as altar server is to assist the priest on the altar during Mass. Altar servers usually serve once or twice a month and attend preparation sessions with the priest. Altar servers can also be members of the youth group and so they help to plan some trips for enjoyment.

6.) Volunteers in the Food Pantry are asked to help staff the monthly food distribution to our area clients on the 3rd Saturday of each month. We ask that you first introduce yourself to Jerry and Barbara McHale by calling the parish office and setting up an appointment.

7.) To join the parish Youth Group, please call the parish office and leave your name and contact information for Tim or Diana Shaughnessy.

8.) To serve as a catechist or catechist aide for our religious education program, please call the parish or religious education office and Mrs. Doherty, our Parish Catechetical Leader, will return your call.


PRAYING TWICE

The Academy of Music (Accademia Nazionale di Santa Cecilia) was founded in Rome by Pope Sixtus V in 1585. Named for St. Cecilia, it was established under the invocation of the Blessed Virgin; Pope St. Gregory I, credited as the author of Gregorian chant; and St. Cecilia, the patron saint of music and musicians. The Academy's first location was the Church of Santa Maria ad Martyres, also known as the Pantheon. You can see pictures of its beautiful auditorium online.

On November 22 we remember St. Cecilia. Many choirs and music societies are named in honor of St. Cecilia and look to her as their patron. Is there a window or picture or statue of St. Cecilia in your church? Does your parish have a choir? Do you know how many members it has? What instruments help make music at your church? What is your favorite hymn to sing with the choir?

St. Augustine said, "The one who sings prays twice." What do you think he meant?

You might hear some of these instruments in a church. Color the ones that you have heard in your parish. Choose one to draw on the front of a card. Inside, write a note to the director of your choir describing how much you appreciate the music they provide. You can present your card to the choir directly after Mass one day or send it to your parish office. Remember, you are a member of the Church and so are responsible—with the choir or cantor—for much of the sung prayer at Mass.


