

## 23RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR A SEPTEMBER 10, 2023

### THEME: TRUE LOVE: A DEBT WE OWE EACH OTHER

Ref. 1st=Ezk.33:7-9. 2nd=Rom.13:8-10. 3rd=Mtt.18:15-20.

When St. Paul tells us (2<sup>nd</sup> reading) that 'we should owe nothing to anyone except love' (Rom.13:8), he wants us to understand that Love is both 'a debt & a duty'. Love, here, does not refer to anything sentimental. As a 'debt', it is something we must 'pay' to escape condemnation & as a 'duty', something we should do to earn our rewards. It is the greatest commandment of God & our way of salvation. Jesus made this clear in His answer with the story of the Good Samaritan to the Lawyer who asked Him, 'Teacher, what is the greatest commandment in the law' (Mtt.22:34-40). Hence, St. Paul describes love (2<sup>nd</sup> reading) as 'the fulfillment of the law of God' because, it does not allow us to sin against God & does no evil but good to our fellow humans. How does this happen?

As a duty, Love is a task that demands courage & compels us to accept or preach the word of God. Hence, God informs Ezekiel & all of us (1st reading) of the duty to speak out/talk to those around us to change from their bad/ sinful ways of life to avoid being held accountable for their sins. This is a duty most Christians, especially Catholics, are weak to carry out in our world of today. We fail to do so most times because we want to protect our pride or avoid 'hurting' the feelings of others – our children, spouses, parents, friends, colleagues, political admirers, etc. It could also be because we do not want to lose our friends, hurt the feelings of another, be disrespected/ignored or be described as being 'judgmental'. We have to know that the duty of love takes us out of our comfort zones to transform others not just for earthly joys but, most importantly, for the salvation of souls. We should not be afraid to carry out the 'duty of love' for any of the above-mentioned reasons after all, God did not assure us that the people we talk to will listen to us or accept our pieces of advice. If they listen to us, that will be wonderful, but if they do not, we would have let ourselves off the hook of any blame from God. Sometimes I feel that I may have a lot to answer God for the things I did not say or do to make people change their ways of life for good & it frightens me. I do not know about you. May God give us the courage to do what we have to! On the other hand, we should see the readings of today as talking to us directly. We should not see them as directed to others - politicians, abusers or the 'bad guys' out there. We can do so much for our salvation by talking to ourselves instead of waiting for someone else.

Because of the delicate nature of this duty and since it is a duty in love, Jesus tells us the steps to follow to win our brothers/sisters & friends back to God. First, He wants us to take an inter-personal approach. This helps to build mutual respect, which could make the person open up to you. It further gives us the opportunity of knowing the influences or backgrounds leading the person into errors/sin & how best to advise or correct him. This does not mean helping the person to hide in his sins. If this does not work, Jesus advises us to involve one or two persons. These must be someone/those who mean much or have influence in the person's life. Where the 2<sup>nd</sup> step fails, Jesus advises us to involve a larger group who share the same ideals & faith with the person. When all these fail, Jesus said that we should treat the person as 'a Gentile or Tax Collector'. From a spiritual perspective, this comment from Christ does not call for hatred, condemnation or banishment but a call to intensify our prayers for sinners & for all who are not conscious of the 'sinfulness' of their actions/behaviors (including you & I). Jesus could not have meant a literal application of His statement because he himself had visible interactions with tax collectors & sinners in the scriptures. Recall that His contact with Matthew (Mtt.9:9-13) & Zacchaeus (Lk.19:1-10), who were tax collectors brought them to conversion & discipleship. He never turned His back on any Gentile or tax collector who sought His help. Hence, in the concluding part of the gospel of today, Jesus places great value on the prayer of the Church & our coming together to pray as a family or group. This does not discourage private prayers but shows the power of coming together in love to pray as a people, family or group with the same faith, hope or aspiration. Next, the 'power of binding & loosing', which Jesus first gave to Peter in Mtt.16:18 is now extended to the other Apostles (Mtt.18:18) to work on His behalf in collaboration with Peter & with each other to save people from their sins & bring the faithful to the glory of heaven.

Dear friends, the 'debt & duty' of Love demands urgent and courageous attention in our times. We must get involved immediately to save our souls & those of others for as St. James said, 'Whoever brings back a sinner will save the sinner's soul from death & win for himself the forgiveness of many sins' (Jm.5:20). Let us keep praying & correcting each other with love to make our world a better place to live and heaven a sure place to go.
