  (Put this in the comments section.) After reading the two
  required books, the choice of fiction or nonfiction is up to
  you. Those who read four or more books by the end of
  summer will receive a surprise.

**Due Date:** Both the book reports and the Summer Reading Log are due on the first day of school.
