Sacraments

Baptism

Parents must be registered and active parishioners of St. Michael's (regularly attend mass, using envelopes, and involved in ministries) for at least 3 months. Before scheduling a **baptism**, you must attend a baptism class at St. Michael's. The baptism classes are held on the second Saturday of the month. Godparents must also be active, practicing Catholics.

<u>Next Baptism class: November 12th at 10am in rm 230.</u> Please bring a copy of your child's birth certificate.

Baptisms are normally the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of the month at 11:30 am in the church.

You must attend a baptism class every three years. Please call the parish office to register for a baptism.

Confession

The priests will hear your confession on Saturday mornings from 9:30 am to 10:30 am and Wednesdays from 5 pm to 6 pm.

Marriage

Couples are required to contact one of our priests at **least** 6 months before they wish to marry to arrange for instruction and spiritual preparation for the sacrament of marriage. A wedding date cannot be set until after the initial interview with the priest. Contact parish office.



St. Vincent de Paul

Today's gospel isn't really about marriage, but about resurrection and the new life it brings.

Resurrection is a way of living with surety and hope.

Resurrection is surety about eternal life because we

have remained faithful to God. The basis for our belief in resurrection is hope. Although hope always has a future orientation about it, when we have confidence in God's grace to bring about change in us, when we have patience with ourselves while that change comes about, we already have something of the future in the present—we are already living this new, resurrected life when we remain faithful to God. The relationship to be celebrated in resurrected life is the relationship of being "children of God" in an everlasting relationship with the living God. We must have zeal for God and God's ways such that it is a way of life for us. God is a God of the living. That is the core of our hope. (Living Liturgy)

The Old Testament prophets have been described as men who had not optimism but who had hope. The distinction is a valid one. Optimism is a human quality; hope is a spiritual one. A Christian may not always be optimistic about the world but he never needs to be without hope. Jesus Christ has risen and is with us. Therefore, at no time should we be without hope for the future. 
