- The Confirmandi and Sponsors are required to attend the rehearsal promptly beginning 2 hours prior to Mass.

- Please plan on the Mass lasting two hours.
- Candidates and Sponsors will be sitting in the front pews facing the altar.
- No assigned seating for families
- Make sure candidates eat a meal prior to coming to rehearsal. No food is provided.
- † If you or a family member is a trained and certified Lector, Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist, altar server or usher here at St. Michael's and would like to serve at the Confirmation Mass, please email Saul Onate Perez, sperez@saintmichaelcc.org.
- If you have a guest or family member attending the Mass that is a priest or deacon, please email Saul Onate Perez, sperez@saintmichaelcc.org.
- A group picture on the altar steps will be taken 45 minutes prior to Mass.
- To preserve the reverence and sanctity of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, no photography or video is allowed during Mass.
- The Bishop and Fr. Larry will be available for pictures after Mass.
- Dress Code for Candidates and Sponsors All attire must be appropriate for Church. The dress code is:
 - o Males: Appropriate attire is expected. Suits are optional. Attire: dress shirt, dress slacks, jacket, tie, dark shoes, socks. No jeans, no sneakers, no flip-flops.
 - o Females: Modesty is expected. Dress or suit, blouse/skirt, dress shoes; shoulders should be covered. No sneakers, no flip-flops, slacks, no spaghetti straps, no low necklines or low backs; no mini-skirts or tight fitting skirts or tops. Skirts and dresses should be no more than 3" above the knee.
 - ** Please note that any Candidate or Sponsor wearing immodest/inappropriate clothing may be asked to refrain from participating in this Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Confirmation Preparation – REQUIREMENTS

St. Michael's Confirmation Preparation Program is a two-year commitment. Confirmation is conferred in the Spring of the second year of the program.

THE PRECEPTS OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH:

- You shall attend Mass on Sundays and Holy days of Obligation
- You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
- You shall humbly receive the Lord Jesus in Holy Communion at least during the Easter season.
- You shall observe the Holy Days of Obligation.
- You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence.
- > The faithful have the obligation of supporting the Church.

The Precepts of the Catholic Church are a description of the absolute minimum actions required of Catholics regarding the Church.

The Church uses these precepts to remind us that Christian life requires a commitment to prayer and active participation in the liturgy and sacraments. If we fall below this bare-minimum level, we can't rightly consider ourselves to be in full communion with the Catholic Church.

Each of these precepts of the Catholic Church is a requirement. Together with the Ten Commandments, they represent the minimum level of moral living. Intentional violation of the precepts or the Commandments is a grave matter, meaning a mortal sin.

- 1. **Holy Sacrifice of the Mass** Candidates are expected to attend Mass each week and on Holy days of Obligation.
- 2. **Attendance** at all classes and special functions is required. There are to be no **unexcused** absences. An attendance of 85%, **no more than 5 absences**, **is required in both years**. After three absences the Candidate and parents will meet with the Director of Faith Formation to discuss their commitment to the program.
- 3. Class work and assignments missed due to an absence: complete the Missed class form with parent and return to the Catechist within two weeks of the missed class.
- 4. **Retreats:** There is a retreat each year. Attendance is mandatory each year.
- 5. **Service Opportunities/Works of Mercy**: 3 each year; total of 6. Over the course of the year, the candidate is asked to devote time to 3 service opportunities to others and to write an account of this experience using the Confirmation Service Journal form. Please refer to the Works of Mercy section of this handout for more information. THIS IS REQUIRED.
- 6. The following items are due by the DEADLINE date on the calendar. Please be sure that all pages are complete and all required paperwork is completed before presenting to your Catechist. Catholic School and Home School submit items to the DFF, Faith Formation Office.
 - a. **Sponsor Certification form**: Choose a Sponsor and have the Sponsor complete, sign this form, and if not a St. Michael's parishioner- have their Pastor sign the form.
 - b. **Saint Report**: Choose a Saint/Confirmation Name and write a saint report on your chosen name

- 7. **Candidate Commitment** The candidate and parents sign the Candidate Commitment agreeing to participate fully in the program.
- 8. Candidates are expected to be on time for all classes and special functions. Tardiness is a sign of disrespect to the Catechists and fellow class Candidates. If Candidates' tardiness causes the class to start late, the Catechists will extend the class time accordingly. Habitual tardiness will count towards missed classes.
- 9. **Complete homework assignments**: Candidates are expected to come to class prepared by reading the Chapter assignment for the week and completing all other assignments. Each *Chosen* lesson contains a "Taking It Home" section that reinforces what was learned in class and what will be covered in the "Review Game" the following week.
- 10. **Doing the "Challenge of the Week":** Each week, candidates will complete a personal challenge that will help them apply that week's material to their own lives.
- 11. **Disciplinary Policy**: Good behavior is expected. For serious misbehavior, parents will be contacted and asked to meet with the Director of Faith Formation to discuss if the Candidate is likely to be ready to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation with the class.
 - a. Cell phone use during class is prohibited unless being used at the request of the Catechist for class activity. Catechists may "collect" phones, ear buds, etc. at the beginning of class if needed.
- 12. **Dress**: Please ensure you are properly and modestly dressed. Please respect our Church and Catechists: no spaghetti straps, no bare midriffs, no plunging necklines, shoulders should be covered, only knee length shorts- no "short-shorts", no t-shirts with profanity or inappropriate pictures, no hats, hoods, or sunglasses, no cleats or flip-flops.

Correspondence: All correspondence will be done via the parent's email.

The Apostles' Creed

The chief truths taught by Jesus Christ through the Catholic Church are contained in the Apostles' Creed. I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord,

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty;

from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages.

God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures.

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son,

who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.

I confess one baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Sacraments

The Sacraments are efficacious signs instituted and given to the Church by Christ.

- A. In the sacraments, we meet Christ and he gives us Sanctifying Grace.
- B. The sacraments act *ex opera operato*. This means that the sacraments unfailingly give grace because Christ works through them.

C. Sanctifying grace is a free gift of God which allows us to become children of God, to share in the divine nature, and to inherit eternal life.

The SEVEN Sacraments

- 1. <u>Baptism</u> is the sacrament of rebirth. In receiving baptism, we are united with Jesus in His death and resurrection, cleansed from original sin and personal sins, welcomed into the community of the Church, and more closely related to God.
- 2. <u>Confirmation</u> is the sacrament by which baptized persons receive the seal of the Holy Spirit, the Gift of the Father and Son. It is linked with the other two sacraments of initiation, Baptism and the Eucharist. In celebrating Confirmation, we ask for the graces needed to live a mature Christian life and to deepen our faith.
- 3. <u>Penance or Reconciliation</u> is the sacrament by which Christians celebrate God's merciful forgiveness for sins committed after Baptism. After a sincere confession of sin, true sorrow, and resolution not to sin again, we receive absolution as a means of reconciliation with God and the community. In penance, Christians are also reconciled with the Church. Although perfect sorrow or contrition restores a sinner to grace, sacramental confession is the ordinary way for serious sinners to be reconciled with Christ and the Church.
- 4. <u>Holy Orders</u> is the sacrament by which members of the Christian community are given special powers and are put in position of special service for the building up of the Body of Christ. Among other things, they preside at the celebration of the Eucharist. They serve as ministers for the sacraments of penance and anointing of the sick.
- 5. The Anointing of the Sick is the sacrament for the seriously ill, the infirm, and the aged, by which the Church asks God to lighten their sufferings, forgive their sins, and bring them to eternal salvation.
- 6. The Holy Eucharist is the center of sacramental life and is primary among the sacraments. We celebrate the Eucharist in obedience to Jesus' instruction at the Last Supper: "Do this in memory of me." When the priest consecrates bread and wine, they are changed into the Body and Blood of Christ. Christ Himself, true God and true Man, is really and substantially present in a mysterious way, under the appearances of bread and wine. In the Mass, the Holy Eucharist is a sacramental sacrifice-the death and resurrection of Jesus are celebrated and renewed. The Eucharist is also a meal which recalls the Last Supper, celebrates our unity in Christ, and anticipates the messianic banquet of the kingdom. In the meal, Jesus nourishes us with the Bread of Life, His own self, and unites us more closely with God and with one another. A Christian must be in the state of grace to receive the Eucharist worthily.
- 7. <u>Matrimony</u> is the sacrament which joins a baptized man and woman together as husband and wife in a union that is permanent and indissoluble. The married couple receives special grace to help them direct their family in loving relationships and toward full participation in the Christian community.

WHAT is a NOVENA?

WHERE DOES IT COME FROM?

A Novena (novem, nine) is nine days of private or public devotion to obtain special graces.

According to New Advent, 'The number nine in Holy Writ is indicative of suffering and grief'. However, it is also faithfully used by people who are searching for answers, healing and personal needs.

The novena in honor of the Holy Spirit is the oldest of all novenas since it was first made at the direction of Our Lord Himself when He sent His apostles back to Jerusalem to await the coming of the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost. It is still the only novena officially prescribed by the Church. Addressed to the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, it is a powerful plea for the light and strength and love so sorely needed by every Christian.

9 Day Novena for the Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Day 1

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

All: Come Holy Spirit, inflame the hearts of all people with the fire of your love.

Leader: Send forth your Spirit and all will be reborn All: And you will renew the face of the earth. Amen

Scripture Reading – Romans 8:14-17

Thought for the day The Holy Spirit

Only one thing is important – eternal salvation. Only one thing then is to be feared – sin. Sin keeps us from eternal salvation. It is the result of ignorance, weakness or indifference. That is why Christ sent the Holy Spirit to us. He is the Spirit of Light to dispel ignorance, the Spirit of Strength to combat weakness, the Spirit of Love to overcome indifference. He enlightens our mind, strengthens our will and inflames our heart with the love of God. Let us then invoke the Holy Spirit daily, for "the Spirit helps our infirmity. We know not what we should pray for. But the Spirit Himself ask for us."

Prayer

Almighty and eternal God, Who has vouchsafed to regenerate us by water and the Holy Spirit, and has given us forgiveness of all sins, vouchsafe to send forth from heaven upon us your sevenfold Spirit, the Spirit of Wisdom and Understanding, the Spirit of Counsel and Fortitude, the Spirit of Knowledge and Piety, and fill us with the Spirit of Holy Fear. Amen.

Thought for the day The Gift of Fear

The gift of Fear fills us with a sovereign respect for God, and makes us dread nothing so much as to offend Him by sin. It is a fear that arises, not from the thought of hell, but from sentiments of reverence and filial submission to our heavenly Father. It is the fear that is the beginning of wisdom, detaching us from worldly pleasures that could in any way separate us from God. "They that fear the Lord will prepare their hearts, and in His sight will sanctify their souls."

Prayer

Come, O blessed Spirit of Holy Fear, penetrate my inmost heart, that I may set you, my Lord and God, before my face forever. Help me to shun all things that can offend You, and make me worthy to appear

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before the pure eyes of Your Divine Majesty in heaven, where You live and reign in the unity of the ever Blessed Trinity, God world without end. Amen.

Come, O Divine Spirit, fill my heart with Your heavenly fruits, Your charity, joy, peace, patience, benignity, goodness, faith, mildness, and temperance, that I may never weary in the service of God, but by continued faithful submission to Your inspiration may merit to be united eternally with You in the love of the Father and the Son. Amen.



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
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
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
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


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
