#### **JUBILEE 2025 PILGRIMAGE**

Jubilee 2025, proclaimed by Pope Francis in the Papal Bull Spes Non Confundit ("Hope Does Not Disappoint"), is a sacred year dedicated to spiritual renewal, reconciliation, and pilgrimage for Catholics worldwide.



In celebration of this Jubilee, the parishes of St. Lawrence and St. Ann in Hoboken will embark on a pilgrimage on September 27, 2025 in Philadelphia, visiting the Shrine of St. Rita of Cascia, the Shrine of Our Lady of Miraculous Medal, the Shrine of St. John Neumann, and the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul.

The tour price is \$75 per person (ages 6 and up). This includes round-trip bus transportation, driver gratuity, lunch, and donations to the shrines. Please make checks payable to St. Lawrence Church.



# What is Eucharistic Adoration?

Eucharistic Adoration is a Catholic devotion dating back to the early days of the Church. It involves exposing a consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, allowing people to sit and pray in the presence of Jesus Christ. Adoration specifically refers to any prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament whether in front of a closed Tabernacle or in front of the exposed host in a monstrance.

# During Eucharistic Adoration, it is appropriate to do any of the following....

- Read and reflect on readings from the Bible or other spiritual writings
- Pray the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet or any other favorite devotions
- Converse with God through spontaneous prayer or iournaling
- Sit quietly and listen or just enjoy being in the presence of Christ

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) formerly known as the "Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults "or (RCIA), is a program of the Catholic Church, oriented towards those discerning the Catholic way of life.

If you are an adult who has been baptized and received your Holy Communion, catechized, but have not been confirmed, then you are a candidate for the Adult Confirmation classes.



# **Prayer Shawl Ministry of** St. Ann Church

Do you knit or crochet? Do your family members and friends tell you that they have enough handmade scarves, hats, mittens, blankets, etc.? Do you have a large stash of yarn?



For the past fourteen years, the Prayer Shawl Ministry has crocheted and knitted prayer shawls and lap blankets to bring comfort to those who are ill or need support as they are healing. The shawls and blankets are physical signs of the prayers and blessings that the ministry members hope will comfort and warm recipients.

Members of the ministry crochet and knit the shawls and blankets at home and meet regularly to plan their activities. The blessed shawls and blankets are distributed at St. Ann's annual healing mass in February. In the event of the Transfiguration we contemplate the mysterious encounter between history, which is being built every day, and the blessed inheritance that awaits us in heaven in full union with Christ, the

Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End.

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

When Pope Pius XII died in 1958, there was the usual buzz of speculation about likely successors. Cardinal Agajanian, Patriarch of the Armenians, was highly thought of as a likely choice. This took many Catholics by surprise, since he had never celebrated the same liturgy as Pope Pius, but followed ancient Armenian customs according to the Eastern Church, which veils the Eucharistic liturgy from sight by a series of curtains, and in which the priest kneels while the people stand for Communion.

In the years that followed, the Second Vatican Council would affirm the dignity and independence of the Eastern Churches, in complete union with Rome, yet different in patterns of life and worship. We have the same faith, the same sacraments, and the same pope. Yet everywhere in the world our separate Churches are combined into families held together by the ministry of bishops. All of this serves as warning: If you ever say, "But we've always done it this way," you are on very thin ice indeed!

#### Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available in Church each Saturday from 4:00pm-4:45pm or call the Parish Office to make appointment.

#### Sacrament of Baptism

Upon the birth of your child, parents please contact the Parish Office for orientation and to register for the required Parents and Godparents' Baptismal Preparation Session. The sessions are currently available online. Baptisms are celebrated the first and third Sundays of the month following the 12:00pm Mass, at 1:00pm.

#### Sacrament of Marriage

Couples are to be registered, active members of the parish and are asked to begin preparation at least one year prior to the planned wedding date. It is advisable for couples to contact the Parish Office before other arrangements are made for the Wedding Day.

# Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick/Visitation of the Sick

The Anointing of the Sick is available to seriously ill members of our Parish either at home or in the hospital. For legal reasons, many hospitals no longer inform parishes when a hospitalized parishioner would like a parish visit. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.
