

THANK YOU to all who were part in any way with our Jubilee Celebration last weekend. It was a wonderful celebration of St. Ann's history and life over these past 125 years. The Jubilee Mass and the Gala at Macaluso's were both perfect in every way. Again, that you to all who made it possible and to all who joined in the celebration.

As we move forward as a parish and an archdiocese, I ask that, when possible, you read up on what is happening with *We Are His Witnesses*. This process will in some way affect all of us. Thanks to all who came out for the listening sessions on Tuesday and Thursday.

Just a reminder about receiving the Eucharist at Mass. It is proper to either present the palm of your hand open like a throne to receive Jesus or to receive on the tongue, to stick it out to place the Eucharist on it. This affirms that you know what you are receiving.

Today, the Dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran in Rome doesn't celebrate a building, but the people that this building represents: the pope and the People of God, that is you and me.

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

Eucharistic Adoration is a Catholic devotion dating back to the early days of the Church. It involves exposing a consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, allowing people to sit and pray in the presence of Jesus Christ. Adoration specifically refers to any prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament whether in front of a closed Tabernacle or in front of the exposed host in a monstrance.

During Eucharistic Adoration, it is appropriate to do any of the following....

- Read and reflect on readings from the Bible or other spiritual writings
- Pray the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet or any other favorite devotions
- Converse with God through spontaneous prayer or journaling
- Sit quietly and listen or just enjoy being in the presence of Christ


Prayer Shawl Ministry of St. Ann Church

The shawls and blankets are physical signs of the prayers and blessings that the ministry members hope will comfort and warm recipients.

Members of the ministry crochet and knit the shawls and blankets at home and meet regularly to plan their activities. The blessed shawls and blankets are distributed at St. Ann's annual healing mass in February. In addition, during the Christmas season, the ministry makes hats and scarves that are distributed to various organizations through the St. Nicholas Pouch project.

Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini (1850-1917) -November 13

Burly longshoremen glared at the woman in widow's dress who interrupted their drinking to beg money, in broken English, for her orphanage. The bar exploded in laughter as one man responded by spitting in her face. "That was for me," the woman smiled. "Do you have anything for the children?" Given today's national debate, could it be as much God's sense of humor as God's will for our sanctification that our first "American" saint should be an immigrant and naturalized citizen? Frances Cabrini, adopting the name "Xavier," confided to Pope Leo XIII her longing to follow her Jesuit patron to Asia. But the Pope replied, "Not East—West!" So she and her Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart exchanged exotic dreams of China for the impoverished reality of Italian ghettos across the United States and Central and South America. Before her death, Frances had founded seventy educational, health care, child, and family service institutions.

Sacraments

Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available in Church each Saturday from 4:00pm-4:45pm or call the Parish Office to make appointment.

Sacrament of Baptism

Upon the birth of your child, parents please contact the Parish Office for orientation and to register for the required Parents and Godparents' Baptismal Preparation Session. The sessions are currently available online. Baptisms are celebrated the first and third Sundays of the month following the 12:00pm Mass, at 1:00pm.

Sacrament of Marriage

Couples are to be registered, active members of the parish and are asked to begin preparation at least one year prior to the planned wedding date. It is advisable for couples to contact the Parish Office before other arrangements are made for the Wedding Day.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick/Visitation of the Sick

The Anointing of the Sick is available to seriously ill members of our Parish either at home or in the hospital. For legal reasons, many hospitals no longer inform parishes when a hospitalized parishioner would like a parish visit. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Holy Communion for the Homebound

For homebound persons who would like to receive Holy Communion regularly, please contact the Parish Office.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is a rite for adults to prepare to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist. If you or someone you know would like to become a Catholic, please contact the Director of RCIA in the Parish Office.

Parish Registration

Welcome to the Saint Ann Parish Family! Please register with the Parish by completing the online Parish Registration Form. Parish Registration is required for Baptisms, Weddings, Religious Education Programs and to attend Hoboken Catholic Academy. We urge all parishioners to make regular use of the envelopes or Online Giving. If you are moving from the Parish, please notify the Parish Office so we can keep our records most current.
