People who have had health issues or near-death experiences generally have a greater appreciation for each day being a gift from God. The rest of us usually



This weekend we enter the season of Advent. This time of the year focuses on our spiritual preparation for the birth of Jesus. While Christmas shopping is important, let us not forget to prepare spiritually for this special feast.

To place ourselves in a spirit of joy, I invite you to join us for our **Wintertide** concert on Tuesday evening December 2nd at 7:30pm. Under the direction of Jeremy and his assistant Rebecca, I can assure you this is one event you don't want to miss.

December 8th, Feast of the Immaculate Conception, IS A HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION THIS YEAR.

Sacraments

Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available in Church each Saturday from 4:00pm-4:45pm or call the Parish Office to make appointment.

Sacrament of Baptism

Upon the birth of your child, parents please contact the Parish Office for orientation and to register for the required Parents and Godparents' Baptismal Preparation Session. The sessions are currently available online. Baptisms are celebrated the first and third Sundays of the month following the 12:00pm Mass, at 1:00pm.

Sacrament of Marriage

Couples are to be registered, active members of the parish and are asked to begin preparation at least one year prior to the planned wedding date. It is advisable for couples to contact the Parish Office before other arrangements are made for the Wedding Day.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick/Visitation of the Sick

The Anointing of the Sick is available to seriously ill members of our Parish either at home or in the hospital. For legal reasons, many hospitals no longer inform parishes when a hospitalized parishioner would like a parish visit. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Holy Communion for the Homebound

For homebound persons who would like to receive Holy Communion regularly, please contact the Parish Office.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is a rite for adults to prepare to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist. If you or someone you know would like to become a Catholic, please contact the Director of RCIA in the Parish Office.

Parish Registration

Welcome to the Saint Ann Parish Family! Please register with the Parish by completing the online Parish Registration Form. Parish Registration is required for Baptisms, Weddings, Religious Education Programs and to attend Hoboken Catholic Academy. We urge all parishioners to make regular use of the envelopes or Online Giving. If you are moving from the Parish, please notify the Parish Office so we can keep our records most current.
