THIRD WEEK in ADVENT: GAUDETE SUNDAY - REJOICE! COME, LORD JESUS, COME!



The third Sunday of Advent is also called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is Latin for "rejoice." Today, we light the rose-colored candle on the Advent wreath, the priest wears rose vestments and the whole Church invites us to celebrate. Of course, we should celebrate; we're more than halfway to Christmas...the Lord is near!!

Invitation to prayer:

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near."

Reflection:

Happy Gaudete Sunday! In our Entrance Antiphon for Mass today (quoted above), St. Paul instructs us to "rejoice in the Lord always." To find joy in every situation. This is an important reminder for each one of us because, as we look at the world around us and even at our own lives, we might find many reasons not to rejoice. Continued attacks on the dignity of human life, increased division amongst people, high prices everywhere we turn – all of this can make it challenging for us to rejoice. We wonder, perhaps, how we can actually put into practice Paul's words, when it seems that so many things are not going well. It's helpful to know that Paul wrote his letter to the Philippians. including this particular verse, while in jail. Even while undergoing this trial, this suffering, Paul is still able to see a cause for rejoicing. What's the reason for Paul's joy? "The Lord is near." God is with him, as, indeed, God is with us still. That is what enables us, as followers of Jesus, to rejoice always –because we know that no matter what is going on in our lives – Jesus, our Lord, our Savior, and our King, is near. He is not far from any of us!

As we begin now this third week of Advent, what can we do to grow in our awareness of, and appreciation for, the presence of Jesus in our lives? How can we allow these next two weeks to truly help us be prepared to celebrate His birth with great joy and to welcome anew Him Who is called Emmanuel – God with us?

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, Your Mother Mary said, "My spirit rejoices in God my Savior." Allow me, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, to know the joy that You, my Savior, want to bring into my life.

Sacraments

Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available in Church each Saturday from 4:00pm-4:45pm or call the Parish Office to make appointment.

Sacrament of Baptism

Upon the birth of your child, parents please contact the Parish Office for orientation and to register for the required Parents and Godparents' Baptismal Preparation Session. The sessions are currently available online. Baptisms are celebrated the first and third Sundays of the month following the 12:00pm Mass, at 1:00pm.

Sacrament of Marriage

Couples are to be registered, active members of the parish and are asked to begin preparation at least one year

prior to the planned wedding date. It is advisable for couples to contact the Parish Office before other arrangements are made for the Wedding Day.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick/Visitation of the Sick

The Anointing of the Sick is available to seriously ill members of our Parish either at home or in the hospital. For legal reasons, many hospitals no longer inform parishes when a hospitalized parishioner would like a parish visit. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Holy Communion for the Homebound

For homebound persons who would like to receive Holy Communion regularly, please contact the Parish Office.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is a rite for adults to prepare to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist. If you or someone you know would like to become a Catholic, please contact the Director of RCIA in the Parish Office.

Parish Registration

Welcome to the Saint Ann Parish Family! Please register with the Parish by completing the online Parish Registration Form. Parish Registration is required for Baptisms, Weddings, Religious Education Programs and to attend Hoboken Catholic Academy.
