FROM THE PASTOR

The Feast of the Assumption

This Thursday, the Church observes the Solemnity of Mary's Assumption into heaven. In doing so, we recall the doctrine of our faith which teaches that when the course of Mary's earthly life was completed, her body and soul were both immediately assumed ("taken up") into heaven. Because she was preserved from the scar of Original Sin and remained sinless her entire life, Mary did not have to die the way other human beings die, nor did her body undergo the normal corruption that a deceased body must endure.

The Feast of the Assumption reminds us that, like Mary, we are invited to walk with Jesus and share firsthand in the experiences of His life and ministry. When we do so faithfully and avoid the temptation to sin, we then have the right to hope for what Mary received, for her Assumption foreshadows exactly what we are anticipating when we choose to follow Christ.

Pope Emeritus Benedict on the Assumption...

By contemplating Mary in heavenly glory, we understand that the earth is not the definitive homeland for us either, and that if we live with our gaze fixed on eternal goods we will one day share in this same glory and the earth will become more beautiful.

Consequently, we must not lose our serenity and peace even amid the thousands of daily difficulties. The luminous sign of Our Lady taken up into Heaven shines out even more brightly when sad shadows of suffering and violence seem to loom on the horizon.

We may be sure of it: from on high, Mary follows our footsteps with gentle concern, dispels the gloom in moments of darkness and distress, reassures us with her motherly hand.

Supported by awareness of this, let us continue confidently on our path of Christian commitment wherever Providence may lead us. Let us forge ahead in our lives under Mary's guidance [Pope Benedict XVI, General Audience, August 16, 2006].

A NOTE FROM A SACRISTAN

What does it mean to "actively participate" at Mass?

We may often wonder what exactly our Lord expects of us when we attend Mass. How do we render fitting worship to Almighty God, despite our human weakness and daily struggles to fulfill his plan? Indeed, it is through both the joys and sorrows of this life that Christ Jesus summons us to offer thanks and praise to God. It is precisely at Mass where we unite ourselves—all that we are—to Jesus, who emptied himself on the cross for our sake. Simply put, our presence alone at Holy Mass is enough "participation" for Jesus. By coming to Mass, we enter into the mystery of our redemption, that is, we participate in the life of Jesus. In union with Christ, we offer the experiences of daily living as sacrifices to the Heavenly Father. In turn, this participation leads us to an abundance of grace, giving merit to our worship.

In the document on the Sacred Liturgy, the Second Vatican Council calls the People of God to "full, conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations." (Vatican II, *Sacrosanctum concilium*, 10) What should such participation look like in a practical sense? How can we "get the most" out of the liturgy? Before attending Mass, it is important to prepare our hearts to receive God's grace in the Eucharist. Certainly, receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation is the best way to ensure fruitful participation at Mass, and should always be received before approaching the Eucharist if we are in serious sin. Other ways to augment our participation prior to Mass may include devotions such as attending Eucharistic Adoration, praying the rosary, offering novena prayers to favorite saints, or reading scripture. Furthermore, practicing the Works of Mercy or simply praying as we go about our daily tasks are beautiful ways to prepare for Mass. Regardless, Jesus always desires our attendance at Mass, and we can actively participate by simply being present and offering our lives to God in fervent prayer. Even if, at times, we don't feel like we benefit from Mass, we can be assured that the Holy Spirit works through us to accomplish what God desires. Ultimately, every Mass is a time for prayer and an opportunity to rekindle our relationship with Jesus Christ. The liturgy should draw us into an encounter with the divine, and remind us that we participate with the angels and saints in offering ceaseless praise to God. Strengthened by the grace we receive at Mass, we are sent forth to serve our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Our baby now weighs about 6 ounces and is about 5.5 inches long, the size of a small banana! He has eyelashes and even fine growing hair on his head. The sense of hearing is now developed. His brain has begun to mature, a process that will continue until he is about 14 years old. Three hundred quarts of fluid a day are sent to the baby through the umbilical chord. This month rapid eye movements begin—a sign of dreaming. The baby now has the same physiological response to physical suffering as an adult—releasing cortisol and norepinephrine into the blood in response to pain. If your baby could talk to you, he might say: “Thank you for keeping me in your prayers and tucked in your heart. I spend my days awake, sleeping, sucking my thumb, and turning somersaults. I curl my fists and fan my toes. I can hear now. I love my mom’s voice, soft music, and the sound of my mom’s heart beat. I dream of the day when I can say ‘I love you.’”
