FROM THE PASTOR

Pastoral Council

On Thursday, July 25th, the newly formed Pastoral Council of Saint Paul of the Cross Parish met for the first time. The purpose of the initial meeting was to begin to establish a process that will lead to the formation of a Mission Statement and Pastoral Plan for the Parish.

The meeting began with a review of the *On Mission Integration Plan* that was developed by the Steering Committee that prepared Saint Winifred and Saint Anne parishes for the merger that occurred on July 1st. This integration plan was presented in March at the two parish assemblies that were held and was also mailed out to each household. One of the main tasks facing the Pastoral Council will be to develop and implement strategies that will hopefully make the integration plan become a reality.

Next, the Council briefly reviewed the financial picture of the parish and some groundwork that has been completed concerning the future of our buildings and facilities.

A significant part of the meeting was dedicated to a candid discussion on where we stand now as a parish community; what are our strengths and how can we capitalize on them? But also, what are the real problems we are facing and need to address?

To be honest, it was edifying to hear from the Council members of the good things and potential they see for our new Saint Paul of the Cross Parish. However, it was equally daunting to reflect upon the very serious challenges that we need to tackle in the coming months.

After much discussion, the Council decided that it would be beneficial to garner a bit more feedback from a representative sample of parishioners before we craft the Parish Mission statement and Pastoral Plan. Two of the Council members volunteered to spearhead this process that will hopefully unfold over the next several weeks.

2020 Mass Intentions

Reservations for the 2020 Mass Intention Book will be open starting *August 9th from 8:30am to 12:00pm in the Convent Dining Room at Saint Anne Church*. Remaining Mass intentions may be requested in the Parish Office after 12pm on August 9th during regularly scheduled business hours.

There will be a limit of 3 Masses per household. Requests will be honored on a first come-first served basis with in-person requests given priority. A \$10 offering, as determined by the Diocese of Pittsburgh, is requested for each intention. Mass intentions must be made in person or by mail. Intentions will not be scheduled over the phone. Only 1 intention may be scheduled per Mass; however, Mass intentions may be offered for a family name.

We are unable to schedule Mass intentions for the 3 days of the Sacred Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, or Holy Saturday. Please note, we cannot guarantee that all Mass intentions will be said at Saint Paul of the Cross Parish. Church law does not permit us to keep Mass intentions for longer than one year. SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Taken from the Saint Andrew Bible Missal

Quarrels over inheritance can provoke bitterness and enmity in the closest of families. Jesus refuses to take sides on behalf of particular interests.

He goes even farther, for He shows what is really at the root of the quarrel: the greed for gain, the love of money. Jesus poses the true question: what is it that assures life? In answer he recounts the shortsightedness of the rich farmer. This man thinks he will assure his life with abundant reserves accumulated in grain bins. But death suddenly snatches him away. Jesus denounces this lack of foresight. By limiting his ambitions to this world, the rich man forfeited his chance for true life.

We are fools if we believe that what is essential here below is to accumulate and produce, if we identify the good life with a solid, reassuring bank account. "To be rich in the sight of God," is to give and to share, to seek life where life is to be found.

STREAM LEARNING - SCIENCE EDITION!

This year, Mrs. Laird's science classes once again studied the embryology of the chicken by viewing pictures and videos and compared them to other animals (including the pig, dog, cat, turtle, and human). Lessons also included the processes of meiosis, fertilization and mitosis, and how these processes relate to the embryology of the chicken. Fertilized chicken eggs were introduced into the classes and the students candled the eggs during development to determine which eggs would hatch into baby chicks and which eggs had stopped developing. They kept a record of their observations throughout the process while learning the parts of the egg, their functions, and comparing a fertilized and unfertilized egg. The students observed and recorded the behavior of the chicks during and after hatching and also cared for the baby chicks while they were at Saint Anne School. SOMETHING TO GET STARTED

There is no ONE way to pray a Holy Hour. It is not a rigid prayer, but we know that there are days when we just can't focus or the words won't come out as easily.

If that's your case today, this guide might help you. Feel free to modify it according to your preferences and needs.

The Lord waits for you!

ADORATION :05:15—NEXT 10 MINUTES

Adore God. He holds the universe like a seed in the palm of His hand. Imagine Christ sitting with you.

Tip: Try the Te Deum in the Compendium. Scriptural helps for adoration—Exodus 33:18-23; Song of Songs 2:8-17; Matthew 2:1-11; John 1:1-18; Colossians 1:15-20; Philippians, 2:6-11.

MEDITATION :25:40—NEXT 15 MINUTES

Contemplate God's action. You may wish to meditatively pray the Stations of the Cross or a Rosary.

Tip: Read a brief Gospel passage. Imagine the scene. Notice Christ's reactions. Think of three ways the passage applies to your own life. Meditate on each line.

PETITION :50:55—NEXT 15 MINUTES

Ask God for what you and others need. He is the king of the universe. He is in control, even when it isn't obvious.

Tip: Pray for your family, your friends, classmates, colleagues. Pray for those who suffer, the poor, the sick, and those who have lost their faith, the Pope, the Church. Pray for yourself.

BEGIN

:00:05—FIRST 5 MINUTES

Ask the Holy Spirit to help you, then make acts of faith, hope, and charity. Tell God how you believe, trust, and love him. Ask for more faith, hope, and love.

Tip: There are great prayers to the Holy Spirit and Acts of Faith, Hope, and Love in the Compendium.

CONTRITION :15:25—NEXT 10 MINUTES

Offer reparation. It's not your love for God, but His for you that saves. Examine your conscience. Offer reparation for the sins of the world.

Tip: Scriptures for contrition—1 Corinthians 13:4-7; Colossians 3:5-10; 1 Timothy 1:12-17; James 3:2-12; 1 John 1:5-2:6; Penitential Psalms: 6, 32, 38, 51, 102, 130, 142.

THANKSGIVING :40:50—NEXT 10 MINUTES

Express gratitude for all God's gifts. He didn't just create you, He sustains your existence our of love in every moment.

Tip: Scriptures for thanksgiving—Genesis 1; Genesis 8:15-22; Job 1:13-22, Daniel 3:46ff.; Matthew 6:25-34; Luke 17:11-19; Psalms: 8, 65, 66, 100, 111.

SAY GOODBYE

:55:1:00—FINAL 5 MINUTES

Make a resolution to act on a light of the Holy Spirit you received: something doable and checkable.

Tip: Ask the Blessed Mother to help you, perhaps with Marian prayers from the Compendium.




