

FROM FR. RICHARD

Labor Day

Monday, September 2nd, is Labor Day, the unofficial end of summer and a day we set aside to honor the dignity of human work in all its diversity. All of us are charged to labor for our bread, whether in an office, a laboratory, a home, a school, with our minds, with our hands, on a computer or outside in the elements. Work is an indispensable part of life, essential for our survival and formative of our character. All human labor has inherent dignity as we work to support ourselves and our loved ones. On Monday, we pause from our labors to celebrate in prayer and parade, in song and reflection, this great capacity to work in a variety of ways to support the family we are charged to care for.

In 1981, nearly 40 years ago, Saint John Paul II issued the third encyclical of his historic papacy entitled Laborem Excercens, "On Human Work." It was the first social encyclical of his pontificate and marked the nineteenth anniversary of Pope Leo XIII's groundbreaking social encyclical, Rerum Novarun, in 1891. "On Human Work" was specifically focused on the dignity and role of human work in our lives. The five chapters of this important encyclical letter propose the Pope's theology of work and situate his fresh insights within the developing tradition of Catholic social teaching. He elaborates on the meaning of work in our lives from a subjective perspective. He further asserts that the worker has priority over capital in the ongoing tension between labor and capital in the modern economy. With an eye on the then solidarity movement in Poland, the pope outlines the human rights of workers in contemporary society. In the final chapter of this very personal encyclical, Pope John Paul II offers a spirituality of work by demonstrating how our work enters into God's saving design for human beings who share in the activity of the Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier.

The issues raised in *Laborem Exercens* are as important today as they were a generation ago when Poland and other Eastern block countries broke free from Soviet domination and began to move toward democracy. Pope Saint John Paul II was familiar with human labor from his own work in the mines and chemical company before he began his seminary studies. The Pope's methodology bears his distinctive combination of the phenomenological description of human experience with philosophical and theological meditation. For anyone interested in a better understanding of the dignity and purpose of human work from a Catholic perspective, I encourage you to read "On Human Work," issued in 1981.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

From the Saint Andrew Bible Missal

At the banquet of life, we do not hesitate to elbow to other people out of the way to get the best places. But Jesus shows us how different this is from the kingdom. To enter His reign we must be humble. Gospel humility is not a religious sado-masochism motivated by self-hatred or obsequiousness. Assertiveness and humility are not mutually exclusive. They both require that we be true to our dignity as image of God. Jesus who was in the form of God left the first place to take the last. That is why "God highly exalted Him." (Phil 2:6-9)

In a second meal image, we find another warning against clever calculation. Our invitation list must include those who have no means to repay us. Christ, who is found in these least ones (Matthew 25:31-46), will return the invitation in the banquet of the kingdom.

"You should be pleased that they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid in the resurrection of the just."


