### December 6, 2020 - Second Sunday of Advent

One in 13 Australian teenagers is taking antidepressants and other prescription drugs for mental illness, as high anxiety fuels childhood depression and suicide.

A mental health meltdown, made worse by the COVID-19 pandemic, is fuelling bullying and truancy in Australian Primary schools. Principals Association president Malcolm Elliott said distressed children were starting to self-harm in primary school.

"There are high levels of family breakdown, uncertainty employment and you chuck in the blinder of COVID-19 and it's a climate of worry. There just isn't enough psychological support for students in schools. They're nervous, they lack personal confidence and they're not able to go with the flow they perceive a threat at every turn. That can lead to conflict in the playground and the classroom."

Mr Elliott said many kids were feeling "angry and upset". "If someone says something that might be insulting, their reaction is eight out of 10 instead of two out of 10," he

One in seven school-aged children has been diagnosed with a mental illness, an alarming Productivity Commission report has revealed. Suicide is the leading cause of death for young Australians aged 15 to 24.

Nearly four per cent of primary school students, and 8 per cent of teenagers, have a prescription for anxiety or antidepressant medication. Australian Institute of Health and Welfare (AIHW) data reveals that 2312 toddlers and preschoolers were prescribed drugs for mental health issues in 2018/19.

When the 2004 Boxing Day tsunami struck, it took the whole world by total surprise. Across multiple countries, it caused a death toll of nearly a quarter of a million people.

The devastation we are experiencing now as a result of the Corona Virus began in a similar manner - with no warning, no opportunity for preparation of any kind, and we are now all too aware of its catastrophic consequences.

But not all disasters come without warning. Sometimes the signs are crystal clear - but it is our choices as to whether or not we take notice of them.

Please read the report alongside this column. Read it carefully. Note the Australian statistics pertinent to depressed children and teenagers likely to self-harm - read it down to the astonishing and fearful revelation that over 2,000 toddlers and pre-schoolers were prescribed mental health-related drugs in the past year.

Now let's suppose the figures are inaccurate, or have even been exaggerated to double what they should be. Even that 50% "discount" scenario doesn't reduce the alarm that should be resounding across our nation.

Those figures, again even they are only half-right, should surely prompt some deep and realistic soul-searching across our nation. Family instability, chronic corporate greed and personal selfishness, destructive technology these have been prominent for some years.

But disenchantment in what were once the sure foundations for society is now daily news - major issues with banks, police,

the law, education, the church. The calls for Royal Commissions to weed out corruption in these institutions and many others are not lost on a younger generation who wonder, more and more, "Who can I trust?".

And when such loss of trust in people is accompanied by lack of knowledge, let alone faith in a loving, generous and forgiving God, then the stability needed for sound mental, emotional and spiritual health is difficult to find indeed.

The warning signs are clear. As a nation, we ignore them at our peril.
