Message from Fr. Mark

Last Monday I was part of the Funeral Mass for Fr Kevin Mogg. Kevin retired about 10 years ago but prior to that was PP of Mornington and for many years PP of Nth Ringwood. I first met Kevin when he was the Rector of our Diocesan Seminary, Corpus Christi College and he was Rector for most of my time there. Kevin was both extraordinary and ordinary at the same time. That's a rare gift, but he had it in bucket loads. At one and the same time he could talk about the footy or the races, the struggles in the lives of everyday people and then he could offer great insight, vision and wisdom for just what the Church and its priests should really be on about. That I am a priest today is due in no small part to him.

His niece delivered a wonderful eulogy and a priest who had worked with him very closely, especially in the areas of Catholic Social Services, preached. They didn't compare their texts! and rather wonderfully, Kevin's niece ended her eulogy with a quote from Vatican II..."The joys and hopes, the fears and anxieties of the people of this age, these too are the joys and hopes, the fears and anxieties of the followers of Christ. For nothing truly human fails to recognise an echo in their hearts." And the priest homilist, remember without any consulting with Kevin's niece, began with exactly the same quote!!! Snap, as they say!

Recently I was attending the first meeting of the Archbishop's Council of Priests and one of the critical issues that emerged was that COVID has reinforced the fact that the way of being Church has changed. The priests around the table, and there are about 18 of us on this group, all spoke of what we called 'the new reality.' People aren't coming to us anything like as much. Our numbers in both Rowville and Scoresby, for instance, are at roughly 50% of pre-pandemic attendance. I think there is a wonderful challenge for us in this and it's this... perhaps the 'church' needs to go to people... after all, that's how it began!

And on Thursday a report was released by Catholic Social Services Australia which spoke to the fact that 3 million of our fellow Australians, including 750,000 children, are living in poverty. Just imagine how the recent flood disasters in both QLD and NSW will increase those numbers.

So with all of this, I'm left wondering. Should we be 're-thinking' what it is to be 'church?' After all, isn't being 'church' being people of the Gospel, people of Good News? I'm not saying we should throw 'the baby out with the bath water' but I do think it's time for a 're-think.' As Henry Ford once said: "if you always do what you have always done, you will always get what you've always had." Time for a change, me thinks?

COVID RULES UPDATE

You're probably aware that the Government rules changed again on Friday, 18 February. The Archdiocese has clarified this for Parish life to mean that parishioners attending Mass no longer need to QR code in, UNLESS they are special Ministers of the Eucharist, members of a choir or COVID supervisor / marshals - all of whom must be fully vaccinated AND still QR code in. To be clear, readers and commentators don't need to QR code in and neither do parishioners not performing the roles named.

Any staff member or volunteer attending the Parish OFFICE must also be fully vaccinated.

For the moment we will still check full vaccination status for everyone attending the 9am Sunday morning Mass - this can be done either by presenting a valid vaccination certificate (whether on paper or on your mobile phone or via a previously issued Parish card), valid medical exemption or (if you wish) still using the Service Vic App and QR coding in.

Thanks for your understanding and stay tuned as rules will continue to change.

March 13, 2022 - 2nd Sunday of Lent

First reading

Genesis 15:5-12.17-18

Taking Abram outside, the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can.' 'Such will be your descendants,' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified.

'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord,' Abram replied 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' He said to him, 'Get me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these, cut them in half and put half on one side and half facing it on the other; but the birds he did not cut in half. Birds of prey came down on the carcases but Abram drove them off.

When the sun had set and darkness had fallen, there appeared a smoking furnace and a firebrand that went between the halves. That day the Lord made a Covenant with Abram in these terms:

'To your descendants I give this land, from the wadi of Egypt to the Great River.'

26 (27):1,7-9,13-14

The Lord is my light and my salvation.

Second reading Philippians 3:17-4:1

My brothers, be united in following my rule of life. Take as your models everybody who is already doing this and study them as you used to study us. I have told you often, and I repeat it today with tears, there are many who are behaving as the enemies of the cross of Christ. They are destined to be lost. They make foods into their god and they are proudest of something they ought to think shameful; the things they think important are earthly things. For us, our homeland is in heaven, and from heaven comes the saviour we are waiting for, the Lord Jesus Christ, and he will transfigure these wretched bodies of ours into copies of his glorious body. He will do that by the same power with which he can subdue the whole universe.

So then, my brothers and dear friends, do not give way but remain faithful in the Lord. I miss you very much, dear friends; you are my joy and my crown.

Gospel Luke 9:28-36

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James and went up the mountain to pray. As he prayed, the aspect of his face was changed and his clothing became brilliant as lightning. Suddenly there were two men there talking to him; they were Moses and Elijah appearing in glory, and they were speaking of his passing which he was to accomplish in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were heavy with sleep, but they kept awake and saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As these were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' - He did not know what he was saying. As he spoke, a cloud came and covered them with shadow; and when they went into the cloud the disciples were afraid. And a voice came from the cloud saying, 'This is my Son, the Chosen One. Listen to him.' And after the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. The disciples kept silence and, at that time, told no one what they had seen.
