## The kingdom of God will be . . . given to a people that will produce its fruit.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells a parable to some Jewish leaders about vinedressers who killed the servants sent by a landowner to collect the fruit of the harvest (Matthew 21:34-39). What is Jesus trying to say?

It would be easy to conclude that Jesus is rebuking these chief priests and elders for rejecting John the Baptist and himself. But he's doing more than foreshadowing his death by identifying himself with the murdered son of the vineyard owner (Matthew 21:37-42). He's not addressing only the Jewish leaders; he is speaking to us as well.

Jesus is telling us that the kingdom of God will be given to people who bear fruit. Throughout Matthew's Gospel, we hear the same message. John the Baptist exhorted Israel's religious leaders to "produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance" (Matthew 3:8). Jesus warned his disciples that "every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down" (7:19). And what's the good fruit he is looking for? Faith in him and love for his people.

Jesus told this parable the day after entering Jerusalem to shouts of "Hosanna" (Matthew 21:9). He cured all the sick who flocked to him there. and everyone was amazed—except these leaders. Instead of accepting him and rejoicing that God's people were healed, they questioned his authority (21:23-24). And in doing so, they bore no fruit.

But that doesn't have to be our story. We can be a fruitful vineyard for the Lord! He has already planted the seed of faith within us. Each day he pours out grace to make us "rich soil" that produces fruit, even a hundredfold (Matthew 13:8). So let's nurture our seed with faith-filled prayer and prune our vines with repentance and works of mercy. Let's bear the fruit of faith, hope, and love. Let's receive the kingdom!



# Gospel Faith Inspirations

One aspect that we see in today's Gospel is the way in which we can fall guickly into sin when we allow greed to remain or grow in us, or even simply adopt a self-focussed approach to life.

Jesus talks about the tenants who disrespect the landowner and his property. Rather than honouring the agreement between landowner and tenant, the tenants look to take advantage of the landowner being away. Rather than being grateful for having a place to live while the landowner was away, the tenants go to the extreme of even killing the son, so they can keep the land for themselves. A life for land.

In what situations do we put our needs over others? Or do we not give to others what is rightfully theirs? There may be times we feel entitled to have something someone else has, and we find ways to justify taking it from them. Doesn't have to be the extreme of physically attacking or killing someone - as the Bible says, the motivation behind being angry or hating someone can be as bad as the motivation behind killing someone. When we criticise someone in public, we steal from them the opportunity of good standing. When we are envious of another's blessing, we steal from them the right to feel blessed; when we shirk our duties and responsibilities, we steal from the other the right to be served and looked after.

We have the responsibility to be the key or corner stone for those around us, to be solid and supportive, faith-filled and loving. This does not mean we must be invincible or hide our flaws, but in fact we need to be fully vulnerable and honest with God. Through this, we are given access to God's goodness and strength, and are able to be the strength for others, despite our smallness and inadequacies. For those you meet, let an encounter with you be an Provided by St Simon's Faith Development Team encounter with God.

Let me sing to my friend
