Gospel Reflection – Luke 10:38–42

"Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."

In today's Gospel, we encounter the well-known story of Martha and Mary—two sisters who welcome Jesus into their home. It's a passage that speaks directly to the heart of our daily Christian life, especially in the busyness of our modern world. Martha is often misunderstood. She is not wrong to be serving—hospitality was, and remains, a sacred duty. She is doing a good thing. But the Lord gently invites her to see that service, while important, is not the only important thing. What Mary chooses—to sit at Jesus' feet and listen—is not a dismissal of work, but a reminder that being with the Lord must come first.

As a parish priest, I often see many "Marthas" in our community—faithful people serving tirelessly in the Church: preparing the altar, arranging flowers, cooking meals, organising events. These are beautiful, essential acts. But I also know how easy it is to become "worried and upset about many things," to lose the peace that comes from prayer and quiet time with Christ.

Mary, on the other hand, represents that contemplative heart—someone who chooses to pause, to listen, to simply be with the Lord. Jesus praises her not to diminish Martha, but to remind us all of our first vocation—to be disciples who sit at the feet of the Master. This Gospel is not about choosing between action and contemplation, but about prioritising. We serve better when we've first sat with Jesus. We become more fruitful in our work when it flows from prayer.

Let us be a parish that encourages both the heart of Martha and the heart of Mary—rooted in prayer, growing in service, and centred always on Christ.

First Reading Genesis 18:1-10

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My lord,' he said, 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.' Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah. 'Hurry,' he said, 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.' Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. Then taking cream, milk and the calf he had prepared, he laid all before them, and they ate while he remained standing near them under the tree. Where is your wife Sarah?' they asked him. 'She is in the tent,' he replied. Then his guest said, 'I shall visit you again next year without fail and your wife will then have a son.
