Marriages require a six month preparation period by Diocesan policy. Call one of the parish priests prior to setting a date.


Funerals: Arrangements are to be made at the Parish Office before publication of the death notice.



ECHOES OF THE RESURRECTION

On Corpus Christi our attention is drawn to the abiding Eucharistic presence of Christ among us, the life-giving flesh and blood through which Christ remains in us and we in him. Many of the traditions associated with this day, including Eucharistic adoration and processions with the Blessed Sacrament, provide an opportunity to reflect on the Eucharist as the “bread that came down from heaven,” the fulfillment in Christ of the gift of manna on which the Israelites fed during their forty years of wandering in the wilderness. Ultimately, the presence of Christ in the Eucharist is a mystery. But it is not simply the mystery of how Jesus can be with us under the appearance of bread and wine. This mystery is part of the greater mystery: the mystery of God’s love for us, God’s desire to be with us every day in the most intimate way possible. When we say “Amen” to the minister of Communion’s proclamation “The Body of Christ,” we are saying yes to this saving mystery.

Dear Parish Family,

Many of us have our favorite hang-out spots, places we like to go to relax and grab a bite to eat.
