This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. Our Masses this weekend begin, similar to how they begin on Palm Sunday, with a special blessing, except on this day we aren't blessing palms, we're blessing candles. Candles that will provide light as we celebrate the Eucharist. a Sacrament and a celebration that so light us on fire. Each of our parishes is called to be a candle in our neighborhood, burning brightly with the love of Christ, not just for our own sake, not just for our own sanctification, but to share with and to draw others into the light of Christ. But for that to happen most effectively we, as individual members, are called to be lit on fire. The one-on-one encounter and invitation is the primary piece of the whole evangelization process. Pope St. John Paul II once said, "In the long run is there any way of handing on the gospel than by transmitting to another person one's own personal experience of faith?" While the Lord certainly can work in large group meetings and gatherings and while He can certainly speak through many other ways, often the most effective way of evangelization is that one-on-one sharing of joy and faith.

We are all evangelizers. The call to share faith isn't a call just for a select few well-read and well-educated people or for those who bear a certain title. By virtue of our Baptism, each and every one of us is called to be an evangelizer. Each and every one of us is called and tasked with being a sharer of the good news. How do we do that? Is there some secret way to go about being an evangelizer? Yes, there is. But the secret is, is that it's not that hard at all. We don't have to attend a special class, we don't have to be a great speaker, we don't even have to fully understand every aspect of our faith.

The best way to start being an evangelizer is to name and to share the joy you've found in Jesus, the difference Christ has made in your life. Ask yourself, "Why am I Catholic? What does being Catholic mean to me?" The best avenue to start evangelizing is to simply share the joy you've found, the ways you've seen Jesus at work in your life. There is no set script, or order, or timeline, but before we start beating others over the head with facts, and deep theological facts and teachings, start by simply sharing the difference that Christ has made in your life with one person. The time for teaching and for sharing more deeply may come, but the first seeds are planted by that personal witness first.
