In the 2021 revised Financial Manual there is a provision for a date annually when every parish, school, diocesan institute, and the Diocese itself will publish an annual financial report. Bishop Caggiano settled on the first Sunday of December. At the clergy meeting on Monday he announced that we will keep this “Accountability Sunday” on this weekend each year. You may recall the financial reports that the Financial Manual used to require. I never really understood them, our finance committee never thought that they were helpful, and I gather that many others did not either. In fact, at last Monday’s meeting the Bishop revealed that they did not make a great deal of sense to him. So, with the issuing of the updated Manual, the Finance Department adopted a new format. We are required to post it on our website. We may, if we like, publish it in our bulletins. I’ve chosen to place it in this bulletin as not all of us who are interested in the finances of our parish want to go online to access the statement. In addition, I asked Mary-Anne Blount, our accountant to draft a commentary for you. With input from the members of the parish finance committee, she offers us the accompanying summary of our income and expenses for the last fiscal year which ended on June 30<sup>th</sup>.

Let’s talk about the doors! I am excited that the work has commenced. Two weeks ago, three workmen from Baut Studios arrived from Pennsylvania. On Monday they removed the stained glass from the doors and put in its place the black panels. The following day, they removed the transoms. I watched for a while as they meticulously cut the glass from the frame. The vestibule is quite dark as a result. I miss the light that would shine through. It’s going to be a dark winter, but sometime this spring the stained glass will return accompanied by new and better operating doors. I thank everyone who is participating in the We Stand With Christ Capital Campaign for making the improvements possible.

Christmas is coming, and I suspect some of you are curious about the Christmas Mass schedule. So am I. I need another week to pull it together. I am waiting to receive some feedback from our Hispanic parishioners. We’ve moved the Mass in Spanish practically all over the place. I’d like to find the right time this year. In addition, I received a request for a 7:30 a.m. Mass on Christmas Day. It’s a reasonable request, and we have enough priests to cover it. Do we really need it? No, but it is a time slot that quite a number of parishioners like. I can tell you with certainty that there will not be a vigil Mass any earlier than our usual 4 p.m. The Holy See permitted Masses to begin in the afternoon last year so as to make room for more Masses due to social distancing. As you

remember, we could only seat 100 people at a time in our church. The restriction is not in place this year, hence there is no exemption from the law which says that a vigil Mass may not be celebrated before the time of first vespers, i.e., 4 p.m.

We are blessed with a magnificent choir which loves to offer praise to God through music. You know, of course, that the Church has always understood the transcendent power of the arts to draw us to God and into the mysteries of faith. With this in mind, our choir is offering again this year on next Friday the beautiful ceremony of Lessons & Carols. You really must come. Believe me, you and I need it—the beauty, the opportunity to reflect and to be moved, and experience the meaning of Christmas.


