From the It's here! Included in this bulletin is the Pastor's Desk flyer with the candidates for the Parish Council. We ran a little late in getting all the bios, formatting, and translating. The timetable we set out for ourselves projected that you would have the slate of candidates on the last weekend of April, and here it is the third weekend of May. The constitution for the parish council calls for elections in May with an annual meeting also in May. We will hold elections next weekend. Please take time to look at the candidates this week. A flyer will be attached to the ballot next weekend, so you will have the names and photos of the candidates to remind you of who is running. If you know that you will not be present at Mass next weekend, you can come to the rectory to fill out a ballot.

I want to thank two groups of people. First the members of the election committee made up of Janet and Patricio Guzman, Joan and Al Mead, Johanna Ordonez, and Paulette Pepin. Their job was to brainstorm and approach folks to ask them if they would be willing to serve on the Council. This committee will count the votes for us and announce who will be seated at the Council.

I thank the candidates themselves who agreed to serve if elected. They are Vannia Aragon, Mario Arreola, Bob Bailey, Geovanni Chalco, Felix Echavarria, Shelly Joseph, Toni Moore, Marita Repole, Fred Visconti, and Ed Ward. Please join me in thanking them for their interest in the parish and willingness to serve it in this capaci-

Our parishioners 18 years of age and older are eligible to participate in the election. On the ballot you will be asked to choose a total of 6 people—four from the English speakers and two from the Spanish speakers. As you may recall from last fall when you were asked to ratify the changes to the By-Laws, the sitting Council adjusted the seats of the Council to always include two of our Hispanic parishioners so that it is reflective of our parish membership. The Council and I believed that this step was important to demonstrate that we are one family in the Lord. You agreed at that referendum. There is much good will and enthusiasm within our Hispanic parishioners and a great deal of spirituality and talent. Their inclusion in the Council has the promise of facilitating better communication and sharing of time and talent for the greater good of St. Peter Parish.

On Saturday, we celebrated First Holy Communion with the children in Religious Formation. There were 43 youngsters who received the Lord Jesus. First Communion ceremonies are special days for the parish. We congratulate our children, and we pray for them that they will treasure the gift of Jesus in their hearts and always

desire to experience Him in the Mass. I thank Barbara Siano and Ashley Sanchez for instructing the children and guiding them to this special day in their lives. Remember: We are looking for catechists for next year so every child who seeks it may receive from us formation in the faith. You can help.

Sacramentos y sacramentales

Dones de la gracia de Dios en nuestras vidas

Reconocemos que los sacramentos tienen una realidad visible e invisible, una realidad abierta a todos los sentidos humanos, pero comprendidos por los ojos de la fe en la profundidad que Dios les da. Cuando los padres abrazan a sus hijos, por ejemplo, la realidad visible es el abrazo. La realidad invisible del abrazo expresa amor. No podemos "ver" el amor que expresa el abrazo, aunque a veces vemos el efecto emocional en el niño.

La realidad visible que vemos en los sacramentos es su expresión exterior, la forma que toman y el modo en que se administran y se reciben. La realidad invisible que no podemos "ver" es la gracia de Dios, su iniciativa generosa de redimirnos por la muerte y resurrección de su Hijo. Esta iniciativa se llama gracia porque es el don gratuito y amoroso por el que Dios ofrece a su pueblo el compartir en su vida, y muestra su favor y voluntad de nuestra salvación. Nuestra respuesta a la gracia de la iniciativa de Dios es en sí misma una gracia o don de Dios por la cual podemos imitar a Cristo en nuestras vidas diarias.

Las palabras y obras salvadoras de Jesucristo son el fundamento de lo que nos comunicaría en los sacramentos a través de los ministerios de la Iglesia. Guiada por el Espíritu Santo, la Iglesia reconoce la existencia de los siete sacramentos instituidos por el Señor. Son los sacramentos de iniciación (Bautismo, Confirmación y Eucaristía), los sacramentos de sanación (Penitencia y Unción de los enfermos), y los sacramentos de servicio (Matrimonio y Sagradas Órdenes). A través de los sacramentos, Dios comparte con nosotros su santidad para que nosotros, a nuestra vez, hagamos al mundo más santo.

Sacramentos de la Iniciación cristiana Bautismo e Iniciación cristiana

El origen y cimiento del Bautismo cristiano es Jesús. Antes de comenzar su ministerio público, Jesús se sometió a sí mismo al bautismo que celebraba Juan el Bautista. Las aguas no purificaron a Jesús; él purificó las aguas... Jesús no tenía necesidad de ser bautizado porque era totalmente fiel a la voluntad de su Padre y estaba libre de pecado. Sin embargo, quiso mostrar su solidaridad con los seres humanos para así reconciliarlos con el Padre. Al conferir a los discípulos la misión de bautizar a todas las naciones, Jesús estableció el medio por el cual la gente pone fin al pecado –original y actual– y empieza por vivir una nueva vida con Dios.

En el Bautismo, el Espíritu Santo induce a responder a la llamada de Cristo a la santidad. En el Bautismo, se nos pide que caminemos bajo la luz de Cristo con un amor cada vez más profundo.
