

Our Fourth Sunday of Easter is known as Good Shepherd Sunday. The Gospel this week always comes from a portion of chapter 10 of

Saint John's Gospel. This year, cycle A, we have versus 1-10. Using very familiar imagery of his day, Jesus describes himself as the shepherd of his sheep. He is a true shepherd, so he approaches the sheepfold from the gate. He doesn't avoid the gate like a thief because he doesn't come to the sheep to steal them or to lead them to harm. His designs on the sheep are salubrious. He will lead them to pasture where they can be nourished and find life. The Gospel ends with Jesus saying, "I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly." An abundance of life is what Jesus leads us to if we want to follow. We do! We are following! We gratefully accept the beautiful life of God and enjoy it.

As you know, Jesus made his disciples Apostles, that is men sent out to shepherd God's people. The Apostles, the first bishops, first appointed deacons and laid hands on them to help with the temporal needs of the Faithful, as we learn in the Acts of the Apostles, and then they selected other men they found worthy to be shepherds in the churches they founded. The order of presbyters, or priests, was established. Today, throughout the Catholic world, we pray to the Holy Spirit to raise up men who will accept the Lord's call to be a shepherd in his image. At each Mass we will pray a prayer for vocations. On this World Day of Prayer for Vocations, we will unite ourselves with our chief shepherd, our Pope, our local shepherd, our bishop, and with our sister parishes for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and diaconate.

There is not a diocese around that has a sufficient number of priests, but we remain confident that the Holy Spirit will not let the Church of God be deprived of shepherds. Indeed, the Spirit has been active. We will experience a great blessing this year in our diocese as six men will be ordained. That is a large class! Our vocations director, Fr. Chris Ford, suggested that parishes prominently display the seminarian poster this weekend. I have one taped to the vestibule wall, but I added one on an easel. We will pray for all seminarians today and for those to be ordained in the weeks leading up to ordination.

Let me say a big thank you to the Men's Society and extend a compliment as well for the breakfast they served last Sunday. I think the breakfast was the best yet. It was delicious, and it provided us with an opportunity to talk to one another. Thank you, gentlemen, for your hard work.

After Patrick Palmieri made the beautiful lectern, he offered to do something else for the church. I suggested a new table for the Gifts in the vestibule to replace the low,

wobbly one in the dark 1970s stain. Then I became quite bold, saying that if he had the time and interest, the two long tables in the vestibule which have served us for decades are beginning to look their age and it would be a wonderful thing if the three tables matched. Well, don't you know Pat got right on it and delivered during Holy Week two beautiful tables you now see. We put them in place and admired them. Pat incorporated many fine details including the quatrefoils, an architectural element that is present within the church. The stain works so nicely with the warm honey colored marble in the floor. Pat had in mind having the tables out for Easter, but after he drove away and I was walking across the street, I turned around and put them in the sacristy fearing that the tops would be quickly scratched if they were not protected with glass. Once again, thank you Pat for these significant upgrades for our beloved church!

Congratulations to the Saint Peter School children who received their First Holy Communion this weekend. Remember them in your prayers that they may always desire, adore, and love our Lord in the Eucharist. We will have two more ceremonies next month for the young people enrolled in Religious Ed.
