

As you know, last Saturday we celebrated First Holy Communion. Seventy-eight children from our

Religious Formation program and one St. Peter School child who had been sick at the time of the school ceremony received our Blessed Lord. I am mentioning First Holy Communion again because I want to tell you that there is hope for the Church in the future. I say that because the children were very attentive during Mass, but, most of all, they knew who they were receiving and did so with tremendous reverence. I was struck by how intently the children looked at the Eucharist when I raised it prior to placing the host into their hands. How beautiful! I prayed that they will always gaze upon the Eucharistic Lord in such a way. That the children were so prepared is due in large part to the formation they receive at religious education, or as the kids often call it, "church school." There is much good that is happening at our Religious Formation program. Barbara, our Director, her catechists and assistants are always looking for ways to reach the hearts of the children, and I believe that we are seeing results in the students.

Today is the last day of classes. I'm sure there are some shouts of joy among the students, kids being kids, but they leave for the year with more knowledge, understanding, and faith in God. I thank all the catechists and assistants for their heartfelt gift of their time and concern for the spiritual growth of their students, and I thank the families who collaborate with us. As the Confirmation students meet for the last time before their Confirmation on Thursday, I will celebrate Mass with each class at 9 and 10:30 in the classroom so that we can have an opportunity to be together in a small setting. Rob Ferucci accepted the challenge of teaching both classes back when we had no one else willing to teach. He is to be commended not only for that commitment but also for how effectively he is able to communicate with the students. Thank you, Rob, for your goodness and generosity.

Next Sunday is Pentecost which brings Easter to its completion. I am printing the text of the Pentecost Sequence, which I happen to like very much, offering it to all of us in advance of the liturgy so that we can reflect on the words. Let's pray that all God's people will open their hearts to and feel the benefits of the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of God, Father and Son.

Come, Holy Spirit, come! And from your celestial home shed a ray of light divine! Come, Father of the poor! Come, source of all our store!
