Today is Pentecost. On this, the fiftieth day after Easter, our Risen Lord with the Father sent the Holy Spirit upon the believers and the

Church, the people of the New Covenant, was born. Pentecost brings Easter to its conclusion. With the end of the Easter season, the double alleluia returns at the conclusion of the Mass, and after the last Mass of the day, the Paschal Candle returns to its place alongside the baptismal font. We celebrate with joy the bestowal of the Holy Spirit, the dynamic Spirit of God living and moving within and among us.

In our diocese today is the day when adult (age 18 and above) Catholics who received First Communion but not Confirmation are confirmed. We have five individuals who will receive the sacrament at the 10:30 Mass – Megan Cheung, Alexandra Henry, Patrick Kelly, Jorge Medina, and Jenesis Veras--and another eleven at 5 p.m. – Santiago Adalberto, Marcelo Cajilema, Diana Castro, Kelly Fajardo, Glenda Franco, Riccy Perez, Ferdy Rivera, Vicente Rodriguez, James Tellez, Rosa Tomin, and Alicia Vanegas. In addition, Glen Segger and his son, Augustine, will be received into the Catholic faith and confirmed at 10:30. This is an exciting day for all of these individuals and for us as a community of faith. We congratulate everyone for being willing to enter more deeply into the life of God through participation in the catechesis.

Speaking of the Sacrament of Confirmation, Bishop Caggiano was here on Thursday evening to administer the Sacrament to 77 young women and men from our religious formation program, St. Peter School, and Sacred Heart Parish. Their names are listed in the bulletin. We congratulate them as well and pray for them that they may utilize the gifts of the Spirit, remain faithful witnesses to Jesus, and enrich the Church through their lives of love, worship, and service.


Last week, I provided you with the words to the lovely Easter Sequence. You will hear it sung or recited today. In the sequence, in our prayer and song—which are prayers—the Church beseeches over and over the Holy Spirit to come to us today and every day. The Church is dependent upon the Holy Spirit for our existence, for our life, for guidance, and for our ability to fulfill our mission to evangelize and to sanctify. The 9<sup>th</sup> century text and chant, *Veni, Creator Spiritus*, calls upon the Holy Spirit to "Kindle with fire brought from above/Each sense, and fill our hearts with love/And grant our flesh, so weak and frail/ The strength of Thine which cannot fail. Drive far away our deadly foe/And grant us Thy true peace to know/So we, led by Thy guidance still/May safely pass through every ill.

Turning to some temporal things, we now have the third of three estimates for the scraping, priming and painting of all the exterior window and door frames of the church. This project is one of the several identified in the We Stand With Christ Campaign. The parish's Building & Grounds Committee will now meet within the next two weeks to review all three approaches and select a firm. After that, we will submit the proposal to the Bishop for review and for the drafting of a contract.

It's holiday weekend and the start of the summer season. Many parishioners come to watch the parade in front of our property. I look forward to seeing many of you on the sidewalk. Enjoy the holiday!
