

Carol suggested to me that I not try to write a column last week before leaving for a few days at Cape Cod. I don't think that I ever did not write

something, but being quite pressed for time, I took her up on the suggestion. Had I written, I would have notified you that on the liturgical calendar we had the rarity of celebrating the Transfiguration of the Lord in place of the 18th Week of Ordinary Time. As I mentioned at the Masses I celebrated, there are a few, and I cannot exactly remember the number, of feasts that take precedence over the celebration of Sundays in Ordinary Time. Feasts of our Lord, like the Transfiguration and the Assumption, are others. Additional ones that quickly come to mind are All Saints, the Dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran (November 11), Saints Peter and Paul (June 29), and the Birth of St. John the Baptist (June 24). Feasts that fall within the special seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter never replace the Sunday liturgy. It's for that reason that when the feasts of the Immaculate Conception, St. Joseph, and the Annunciation fall on a Sunday they are celebrated on the following day, a Monday.

This weekend a representative of the Corona Self-Help Center will speak briefly at the conclusion of each Mass. The Center was here many years ago, and its Director, Kurtland Longa, has been asking me to visit again to inform our parishioners of the free services that the organization provides for drug addiction. I hesitate to have organizations come to speak at the parish unless they are Catholic based. I cannot endorse the work of the Corona Self-Help Center and Kurtland understands that. At the same time, I know that recovery programs are often difficult to get into and expensive. Through fundraising and benefactors, Corona is able to provide help to people who cannot afford a recovery program. I liked that as well as that the services are in Spanish as well as in English. The presentation is short, there is no soliciting for support, only a table for the dissemination of information.

I can tell you that our Building & Grounds Committee made its final selection of a firm to scrape all the exterior church window and door frames and sills, replace any rotted wood, prime and paint. New England Construction based here in Danbury has been chosen. MaryAnne Blount took the burden off me to prepare the documentation to send into the Bishop's Office for review. Recall, that all projects over \$50,000 must be reviewed by the Bishop and the diocesan architect, and then the Legal Office drafts the contract which is signed by the Bishop. The paperwork will go out on Monday. The estimate for the job is \$382,867.00 but not to exceed that amount. The work could cost less, and we anticipate that it will, but the proposal is written to cover the replacement of the maximum

and can tell if it is soft. When considering the three bids, the committee liked that New England Construction will work with a New Milford mill that has the ability to replicate any molding that is compromised.
