If you went downstairs after the Masses, you saw quite a lot of items on the tables and may have wondered if we had sold anything. We had an abundance of items this year and, as I had mentioned, so many of them were in excellent or new condition. I think hot on the list of items sold were table linens and holiday decorations. We sold quite a bit more on Sunday. So, how much profit did we realize? \$5,072, our largest amount ever! We have to give credit to our parishioners who donated so many great items. Thank you to everyone. Now I want to give special thanks to the volunteers. Setting up was a two-day process, involving unpacking, setting out the things and pricing them. On Saturday, we had volunteers working the floor, assisting customers to their cars, and acting as cashiers. On Monday, more additional help came to pack what was left over, store what we wanted to keep and drive the rest of the boxes to Savers. Is there a lot of work involved in the tag sale? Yes, but we find it fun. On Thursday evening, the Feast of Our Lady of Aparecida, Bishop Caggiano dedicated the new Brazilian Catholic pastoral center on Vail Road, Bethel, the former Capellaro's Grove, and the chapel was consecrated. Thursday's ceremony capped the Quasi-Parish's three-year effort to find, purchase, and refurbish space into a pastoral center would accommodate their needs. Fr. Leonel tells me that there is still some work to be done, but overall the building is completed. We congratulate the community and are happy that they have achieved their goal. We ask God to bless their pastoral work.

Yesterday, Saturday, was the annual presentation of the Saint Augustine Award for Service at the cathedral. Brenda took over managing the games at a time of some turmoil in the parish and kept

bingo alive. For twenty years, she has been at the helm of this most important fund-raiser for the parish. In the last fiscal year, bingo netted the parish \$40,000. Bingo is our largest fund-raiser. We would be hard pressed to make up that revenue without bingo. Brenda's energy, friendly rapport with the players, and fairness in applying the rules has earned her the admiration of players and volunteers. Besides bingo, for years Brenda served on the Parish Council and chaired the Parish Life Committee. She remains on that committee and annually continues to chair the tag sale. We are very grateful to Brenda for her dedication to the parish—her life-long parish by the way—for her good heart and cheerful willingness to serve Christ and His Church. Congratulations Brenda and thank you!

Our Diocese celebrates its 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary next weekend with Mass at the cathedral on Saturday at 11 a.m. The Bishop has sent two tickets to each parish to be distributed to parishioners in any way he wants. Rather than select people myself, I decided to offer them to anyone who would like to go, but I forgot to do that last weekend. (There is too much to keep track of.) Now it's a little short notice, but anyone who wishes to go, let me know. I have to give you the ticket to present at the cathedral. The Bishop, who directs the liturgy within his diocese, has ordered that we commemorate our diocesan anniversary next weekend with the votive Mass for the Church in place of the 29<sup>th</sup> Week of Ordinary Time. We will place the references for the readings and Mass propers in next week's bulletin.


