Last Saturday, the 13th, members of our parish leadership attended a meeting held at St. Rose of Lima. There were about twelve of us present. The Bishop set dates for each of the nine deaneries. As a reminder, our Deanery covers the towns of Danbury, Bethel, New Fairfield, Brookfield and Newtown. (Newtown was not initially in our deanery but recently moved into it.) As a diocese, we are moving into the next phase of what Bishop Caggiano calls "The One," and part of getting started on this initiative to draw people to Christ, he wants us regionally to listen to one another, to see where there is commonality in our challenges, and to begin dialogue between parishes. At this point I probably need to remind us all about what "The One" is. The Bishop is talking about the primary thing we do as Christ's Church. What is that? Have people encounter Jesus and then accompany them in the faith. As the Bishop repeats, he is not rolling out a new evangelization initiative; rather he is suggesting that we do what the Church has always done. It engages a person's heart, shows a person a life of virtue and truth. The Bishop wants everyone to focus on this one thing but not in isolation but as a whole. The deaneries provide a natural geographical area of cooperation.

At our last presbyteral meeting, the Bishop also spoke of the National Eucharistic Renewal. Some of you may have read about it. I know one person asked me why we were not doing anything in conjunction with it. Bishop Caggiano wanted to hold off because he wants to tie it into the One. Beginning this month through May we will begin a preparation period. Our diocesan renewal will begin as the national renewal ends with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament which will enter our territory on May 19 through the 21st. There will be much more to talk about in regard to the Eucharistic Renewal in the months ahead.

I was asked back in November to be the Pastor Co -Chair of the 2024 Annual Bishop's Appeal. I am telling you this because the next issue of the Fairfield County Catholic will soon arrive in your mailbox. In it you will find an article with me in it. A reporter for the paper interviewed me over the phone. In all honesty, I haven't really grasped what my role is as a co-chair, but so far I've participated in a zoom meeting with parish leaders on Tuesday and attended a reception on Wednesday evening. I've had to offer prayer and give short talks about how I view the Appeal from a pastoral point of view. The 2024 Bishop's Appeal, entitled "One in Christ" kicks off next weekend. You can expect to listen to the Bishop's address to us at each Mass. Regarding the 2023 Appeal, Joe Gallagher, the head of the Development Office, was very pleased to announce that on December 21 the Appeal hit its goal of 8

million dollars. The goal was reached through the generosity of some 14,600 people. (I can't recall the exact number.) One of our hopes is that we can persuade more than 15,000 people to participate in this year's Appeal and reach the goal, which remains at 8 million, in pledges by June 30. Some donors like to wait to the end of the year to pay and that is fine, but the development office would like to avoid the anxiety of whether or not the goal will be met by receiving pledges adding up to the 8 million before summer. We were very generous to the 2023 Appeal, and I commend the 183 of us for our sense of solidarity and commitment to the ministries of the Church. We donated a total of \$83,213 to the Appeal. Bishop Caggiano sent us a letter just before Christmas thanking us for our generosity.


The Bishop's Lecture Series 2024...
