There is not one but two kick-offs today. The Annual Bishop's Appeal begins today and so does Catholic Schools

Week. Let's begin with the ABA which is entitled "One In Christ." I will say a few words at each Mass this weekend, and we will listen to the Bishop's message to us. Both the audio and video address have also been put on our website if you would like to listen and view it there. You might ask why we have this Annual Appeal. The simple answer is to provide the funds for ministries that the Diocese needs to conduct that would be impossible for individual parishes. The Diocesan Church has no way of raising money for its ministries that serve people except for appealing directly to us. The cathedraticum, that is the tax on the parishes based on the parish's income, is money to pay exclusively for the expenses of the chancery. So, there are two income streams, one to support administrative costs; the other to do the good works of preaching the Gospel, serving others through human services and pastoral care, and building up the Faith by providing the young and old and everyone in between with encounters with the living God. The goal of the Appeal remains the same this year at 8 million. Our parish goal remains at \$58,000. Sufficient for today is to make everyone aware that the Appeal is beginning and to direct our thoughts towards joining one another as God's family to do the great and necessary things we must do as Christ in the world.

Let's turn to Catholic Schools Week which runs this week. This week is a time to celebrate our schools and the mission that they have in our society. Catholic schools are dedicated to teaching he whole human person, the intellect, the social, and the spiritual through an environment where Jesus is present, loved, talked about, and modeled. Catholic Schools Week is also a time when we reach out to alumni and all Catholics of good will to support our schools through prayer and gifts. I wish we did not have to include that element, but we do. St. Peter School has reached its highest enrollment since I've been here. We have 274 students enrolled from Pre-K 3 to 8th grade. We cannot fit many more students in the classrooms which is a good problem to have. The pace of education costs out-strip our families' ability to pay the actual per student cost, so St. Peter School relies on the generosity of several donors, the Bishop's scholarship fund, and donations from us. There are envelopes in the pews and an envelope in your offertory packet. Our parishioners are very supportive of the school, and I thank you for how you aid the kids during their fundraisers. I am hoping you can make a gift during Catholic Schools Week. Mary Lou Torre is sharing with you two essays from two of our students.
