I am very pleased to announce to you that our calendar of events is now available on our website! Yeah to us. We

are advancing further into the 21st century. I told you of our intention late last summer to have a calendar up on the website. We anticipated that it would be up in September. So, what happened? Lots, but I cannot explain in detail the technical issues. We worked with Microsoft because some years ago, the Diocese had all the parishes migrate to using it. A primary reason for all parishes to be on the same software was for communication purposes. Everyone has an address within the system, eliminating emails to personal emails. The system is supposed to be more secure. The software package has many applications (not that I can remember them or that I use them) including a calendar. Perfect. We have the capability to create a calendar at our fingertips without looking for a program. So, with Marty Carangelo's help (our free IT man) Carol assembled the calendar over the course of weeks. It looked great. It was color coordinated. Each organization within the parish had its own color. Visually it was lovely, but beyond that, it helped viewers find what they were looking for quickly. When it came time to load it onto the website, it wouldn't work! What? We learned that eCatholic, our web platform, does support Microsoft. We could purchase a software package that is or use Google which already is integrated with eCatholic and is free to us as a customer. We chose the latter, and the process began to move forward once again. In the interim, our free IT man had heart surgery and was out of commission for weeks, Christmas came, etc. etc. The calendar went up a couple of weeks ago. It doesn't have distinguishing colors anymore (not available with Google), but it looks good. So, if you need to check on when, where, or at what time a meeting or some event is being held, you can now go to our site on your computer or phone and get the information you need. Obviously, the accuracy of the calendar depends upon staff and committee chairs giving Carol timely updates. I am asking them to be mindful of sending in additions and subtractions.

"I can't hear you from the altar." "I can't hear you from the pulpit." "I can't hear you from the chair." "I can't hear from this or that section of the church." Madonna! I've heard you! Last year, part of the guts of the sound system died, and we had Pascom Sound here for a repair. Pete Sandone, the owner, was able to get us by with a used part. We spoke at that time about not just repairing the sound system but upgrading it. The current sound system is at least 20 years old. I believe it was upgraded at the time of the renovation work in 2000-01. As with everything electronic, advances in technology have occurred in the last 20 years. We decided to replace our system with new

equipment and new speakers. The equipment arrived and is in the sacristy. Installation will begin on Monday and is expected to take all week. We are not discarding the current speakers. At some point, we will be doing interior work on the church ceiling and clerestory windows, and we don't want to expose brand new speakers to potential damage. So, we are storing them in the rectory basement and will put them back up during the repair work. Next week I will ask you if you can hear me. You better say better than ever!

The Scrutinies begin for the Elect, our three young women entering the Church through Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. The Scrutinies happen on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> Sundays of Lent and are designed to give them resolve to fight against sin and temptation and strength in Christ who is the way, the truth, and the life. We have one more individual, Jhoselin Organillo, who will complete her initiation into the Church with Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. Jhoselin is receiving her instruction in the Spanish RCIA. She is also in our prayers.

## Music Notes—-

# Reflections on Gregorian Chant – Part 3

Over the last two weeks, I talked about "what" Vatican II had to say about Latin and Gregorian chant at Mass. The week, I would like to reflect on "why?"

I'm often curious to see what other Catholics are singing at Mass. In fact, I've become a bit of a YouTube junkie, watching Masses from around the world (St. Mary Sydney, St. Peter Rome, St. Sulpice Paris, etc.). And I'm always heartened to see how many churches sing Gregorian chant. The French in particular love Gregorian chant, entire congregations singing the Gloria from the Missa de Angelis, or Credo III (not easy chants for a congregation to sing!). Often, I find myself joining in, uniting my voice with Catholics from around the world praying same words, in the same language, using the same Gregorian chants.

Why Gregorian chant? It unites us in our One Holy Catholic faith. Through these Latin chants, we: 1) unite our voices with others around the world; 2) we unite our voices with those from previous generations; 3) we unite our voices with generations to come. Sing to the Lord (2007), published by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops summarizes it best: "Gregorian chant is uniquely the Church's own music. Chant is a living connection with our forebears in the faith, the traditional music of the Roman rite, a sign of communion with the universal Church, a bond of unity across cultures, a means for diverse communities to participate together in song, and a summons to contemplative participation in the Liturgy." (par. 72). So why Gregorian chant? Unity!




