

Break the Cycle of Poverty: Support the Catholic Campaign for Human Development

On Sept. 19/20, we'll be taking up a collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development. CCHD addresses the root causes of poverty in America by supporting communitycontrolled, self-help organizations of lowincome people. Here in our Diocese, four lifechanging community organizations have been approved for major CCHD national grants. They include a farmworker organization, a workers' center, a land trust of low-income people becoming homeowners in inner city Rochester, and a refugee organization empowering their members to know their rights as tenants. In addition, 25% of the funds we collect will remain in our diocese to fund smaller, local antipoverty projects. By supporting this collection, you are giving people on the margins a hand up, not a handout.

Why Forgive?

The central message of our Christian faith is clearly evident in our readings for this weekend. While it is central to our faith, it is the most difficult to live. It is FORGIVENENSS! In his article, *Forgiveness: Taking the Word to Heart*, J. Randall O 'Brien writes:

WHY FORGIVE? The words jumped off the face of Time magazine, January 9, 1984, even as the cover picture shocked the world. With his left arm in fatherly fashion around Ali Agca, the Turkish gunman who had attempted to take the Pontiff's life, Pope John Paul II tenderly embraced the right hand that had aimed and fired a near deadly round into his person on



May 13, 1981. Whispering words of pardon, the Pope forgave his would-be assassin. A whisper, perhaps, to Agca, the Patriarch's words and action reverberate loudly around the world till this day as an altar call to the spiritually deaf. In forgiving his young, misguided enemy the Head of the Catholic Church offered a troubled, hate-filled world an unforgettable image of grace. Even among Christians, many of whom appear to be more comfortable with Christ in print than in practice, the Pope's action was disarming. The church leader known to millions of Catholic Christians worldwide as The Holy Father shared, "I spoke to him as a brother whom I have pardoned, and who has my complete trust." In forgiving his potential killer, Pope John Paul II was taking the Word of God to heart. For the whole emphasis of the New Testament is on forgiveness of sins, reconciliation, and holy living manifested and made possible by the love of God through the Cross of Jesus Christ (Romans 5:5-6; 1 John 4:9).

It should not have shocked believing people that the Holy Father, now Saint, Pope John Paul II forgave the man who tried to kill him. It should not have shocked believing people that in October of 2006, following the tragic Amish school shooting of 10 young schoolgirls, in the midst of their grief over this shocking loss, the Amish community didn't cast blame, they didn't point fingers, they didn't hold a press conference with attorneys at their sides. Instead, they reached out with grace and compassion toward the killer's family and offered forgiveness to the killer, who also killed himself.

Such forgiveness is central to our Catholic Christian faith. Yet, it can be so rare, so shocking. Total unconditional forgiveness is the greatest challenge for a person of faith to live. Jesus not only calls his followers to this important action; he also exhibits it on the cross, the ultimate act of forgiveness which is our only hope for mercy and eternal life.

Some will tell us that it is also healthy to forgive and not hold grudges; that it will unburden us and help us to live more at peace. However, the reason we must forgive is because Jesus did, and does, and therefore so must we.

Are you having trouble forgiving someone? (Politicians? Church leaders? Parents? Children? Brothers? Sisters? Neighbors?) Whoever it is, Jesus' message is the same ...forgive them.

May the Eucharist we receive as the ultimate Sacrament of forgiveness and mercy fill us with the grace to forgive as we are forgiven.


