


The Pastor's Two Cents

Before I formed you...I knew you

I have mentioned before about my having to memorize the Baltimore Catechism prior to my Confirmation in sixth grade. As I mentioned, I only remember two of the questions found in the beginning of the book: "Who Made you? and Why did God make you? These important questions come to my mind today because in our first reading God speaks to Jeremiah saying, "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you..." This message is so important for us to remember.

Your existence was not an accident. It was not a mistake. You have value! Before God formed you in the womb God knew you. Think about that for a moment.

Many people in the world today are unsure of their value. Many are deeply insecure, so when the world says we're only worth as much as our material success and our bank account, we believe it. Many people today try to increase their feelings of self-worth by accumulating worldly possessions and by attempting to become a great success in a worldly way. They define their worth by what they can or cannot do. That is not what God says. Your worth is not found in what you do or in the possessions you have. God says you have value and worth because God created you, consecrated you, and loves you!

Not only that, but, like Jeremiah, God dedicated you. In the Sacrament of Baptism God dedicated each of us as his beloved children. Once we realize that our purpose is to know God, to love God, and to serve God, everything else falls into place. God tells Jeremiah that it will not be an easy road but reassures him that "I am with you to deliver you." So it will be for our journey. God will be with us! Too often we forget that.

When God called Jeremiah to speak to the people of Judah, Jeremiah was aware of his inabilities and felt unable to fulfill this mission. So many times, people try to excuse themselves from service because they recognize their own shortcomings. Such was the case when I felt God may be calling me to the priesthood. We believe we are not qualified to accomplish the task at hand, but in reality, God isn't primarily concerned with our talents or abilities. God is just looking for willing people; people who are willing to say yes to God. Just look through the sacred scriptures to see who God called. Look at the response of the Blessed Mother. Look at the apostles Jesus called to follow him.

Never forget who created you and loves you like no other. Seek the grace in the Eucharist to say "Yes" to God. Seek to know him, love him, and serve him in this world until you live with him in the world to come. Remember, only three things endure.



Sunday Gospel Reflection **The Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time** **January 29th & 30th**

Luke 4:21-30

Gospel Summary

Jesus went to Nazareth and taught in the temple. At first the people were amazed at his knowledge but then it occurred to them, he was one of them - a carpenter in their own village! They became very angry with Jesus and planned to throw him bodily from a nearby mountain top. Jesus simply walked through them and left. Some scholars say that the crowd's reaction and Jesus escaping them to continue his teaching and preaching is a foreshadowing of Jesus' death and resurrection and the mission of the Church to continue spreading the Good News.

Reflection for Parents

How many times do we react to what appears to be the situation? A few times of being wrong slows us, especially parents, down and teaches us that things are not always as they seem. It takes time and often forces us to eat humble pie (or at least laugh at ourselves), but very often, by the time we get the story we recognize that we have come to the wrong conclusion, that the evidence is misleading. Parents need to show their children that they trust and have faith in them. If our first impression turns out to be correct, then we can take necessary disciplinary steps, but at least children recognize their parents' faith in them as our first response.

Bringing the Good News Into Your Family

When the people of Nazareth had no faith in Jesus, Jesus could not work any miracles. He had to leave the area and go where people believed in him. Share together places in your own lives, either individually or as a family where weak faith prevents Jesus from working in your lives. What steps can you take to allow Jesus to enter? What can you do to help one another develop a stronger faith?
