

My sisters and brothers in Christ,

I recently completed a book entitled “The Crisis of Bad Preaching” by Father Joshua Whitfield. This short text provides some wonderful insights into the challenge of preaching the Word of God in the Catholic Church, and especially the pitfalls which a preacher can stumble on as he prepares his homily. While the text was written primarily for those charged with preaching on a regular basis (like a parish priest) and, I will admit, offers some great challenges for my own method for preparing a homily, Father Whitfield offered some very worthwhile recommendations for the congregation to consider as they prepare themselves to hear the homily on a weekly basis. I’d like to offer the first five of these recommendations for your consideration this weekend:

1. Read the Sunday readings in advance so that, through personal prayer, reflection, and study, we allow the Word of God to touch our lives. This will make the scriptures more familiar to us and more likely to impact our lives. This way, even if the homily isn’t stellar, we’ve had the chance to gain wisdom from the Word in advance.
2. Pray for your homilists. Prayer is an absolutely indispensable element of preparing a homily for Sunday. Preachers spend a lot of time with the Word in prayer during the week; knowing that you are praying that the Holy Spirit inspire our preparation would be a very comforting thought and helpful aide.
3. Expect the Holy Spirit to Speak. As we come to Mass, say a little prayer to the Holy Spirit that we might be alert to the one thing we really need to hear in the homily. It might not be the same message for everyone, but we need to pray confidently expecting our prayer to be answered. “Holy Spirit, help me hear what I need to hear this week at Mass.”
4. Struggle to Listen. Not every preacher speaks as clearly as we might like, but if we make the effort to listen attentively, we will be able to hear the core of the homilist’s message and be encouraged by that message. Also, don’t be afraid to ask the preacher to speak more slowly (I know I can speak too quickly), or to enunciate more clearly in the homily. We need to be reminded every so often that others may not hear us as we think they are hearing us.
5. Don’t complain about the length of the homily. This may be the toughest one to embrace. For the most part, Catholic priests and deacons try to keep the Sunday homily under ten minutes, but there may be occasions we preach longer. Be patient during these longer homilies and listen. If it is well prepared, it likely won’t seem so long. If it isn’t the best homily, see nos. 3 and 4. Next week, I’ll share the rest of Father Whitfield’s recommendations for the congregation. But be assured, his book has given me a lot to consider as I prepare my homilies, and I pray that the effort I put into preparing bears fruit in the lives of all our parishioners and visitors to the parish. Preaching is never easy, but it is one of the highlights of priestly ministry. May God’s Word be in our hearts and on our lips always, so that we may bring the Good News to all.


STEBENVILLE EAST

REGISTER FOR TOTUS TUUS



A bounce house for children is included in the fun this year. Those attending the Family Day are welcome to bring lawn games like corn hole, volleyball or badminton as well as beach toys.


The family event will take place rain or shine.
