

Pastor's Notes

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

I'm not letting my vacation interfere with sharing a few thoughts with you this weekend. Hopefully my trip to New Jersey and the Finger Lakes did not include an encounter with an 18-wheeler this year.

As a result of the Catholic Leadership Institute survey, which was completed earlier this year, three distinct priorities to strengthen our parish life were selected. For each priority, several goals were created as a means to achieve the priorities. The three priorities are: Strengthen the liturgical life of the parish, increase opportunities for adult faith formation in the parish, and improve parish communications. While all three of these priorities have goals associated with them, I would like to highlight just one goal related to the increased opportunities for adult faith formation: the Light of the World Retreat.

Last March, our parish hosted its first Light of the World Retreat. More than twenty parishioners gathered together with the retreat team for a weekend of faith and fellowship. It was an opportunity for them to reflect upon their baptismal call to holiness and to deepen their personal relationship with Christ. While the weekend required a great sacrifice of time, the participants all expressed their appreciation for the growth in faith they experienced. We are hosting our second Light of the World Retreat on the weekend of October 11-14, 2019, and we want to invite all of our parishioners to consider registering to participate.

As a means of encouraging parishioners to accept this invitation, at all Masses this weekend recent participants of the Light of the World Retreat will give a short, personal testimony and extend an invitation for others to experience the power of the Holy Spirit in their lives by taking time out of their busy lives and give that time to God.

Our goal of registering up to 30 participants for this Light of the World Retreat is still achievable, so please prayerfully consider registering. Our discipleship in Christ requires that we take time to grow in our life of faith; this is the perfect opportunity to experience this growth.

Regarding the other priorities and goals, I will share them in future notes.
