

My dear family in Christ,

The gospel reading this week can be a little disconcerting when first read or heard proclaimed. We hear of wars and insurrections, plagues, famines, and earthquakes, all as precursors to the return of Christ in glory. Well, if we pay attention to the news, we know that all of these things are happening regularly in the world around us. Hardly a week goes by that some natural disaster hasn't devastated an area of the world, or a fresh outbreak of violence strikes upon innocent victims around the globe. Does this mean that Christ is about to return? Well, I'm not sure; however, I do know that Our Lord reminded his disciples that no one knows the day or the hour of His return. So we are called to live each day in the expectation that this could be the day He returns.

If this is true, then what do we do about the wars, violence, insurrections, and natural disasters which plague the world? None of us are likely to be so powerful or prominent that we will be able to affect national or international changes in regards to war, violence, or disasters; however, we can decide to make changes in our personal lives and on the local level which will not only have an impact in our lives, but in the lives of those around us. To think globally and act locally is a good motto to live by as we face a sometimes unkind and inhospitable world. Perhaps the best way of approaching the pressing issues of the world is to make the Prayer of St. Francis our own and to strive to live it out:

*Lord, make me an instrument of your peace,  
Where there is hatred, let me sow love;  
Where there is injury, pardon;  
Where there is doubt, faith;  
Where there is despair, hope;  
Where there is darkness, light;  
Where there is sadness, joy;*

*O Divine Master,  
Grant that I may not so much seek  
To be consoled as to console;  
To be understood as to understand;  
To be loved as to love.  
For it is in giving that we receive;  
It is in pardoning that we are pardoned;  
And it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.*
