

Pastor's Notes

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ:

Sometimes the only certainty in life is uncertainty. It is remarkable to consider that news of an outbreak of a new virus in China two months ago would bring such disarray and confusion into our lives in Vermont today. It has been a powerful reminder that the entire world, and those who live in it, are connected one to another, and what happens in a far flung corner of the world could very well play an important part in our lives.

As we enter into the second half of our Lenten journey and consider the story of the healing of the blind man from St. John's Gospel, perhaps we might pray to have our own eye opened to the fact that we are indeed connected to and reliant upon so many others in order to live our lives. With this realization, a particular grace we might pray for is the willingness to ensure that our actions touch upon others in a positive and Christ-like manner. The cure of the man born blind had an impact, not only upon his life, but upon those who knew him and those who came to know him after his cure. It is my hope that our positive encounter with Christ impacts not just our lives but the lives of those we meet now and in the future.

One of my fears of the present health scare is that social distancing—a valid means of ensuring our health—in the future means that we will choose never to interact with others for fear of what might happen. There will be so many opportunities for us to share our faith and help others that will be lost because fear of illness or contamination causes us to so isolate ourselves that we become an island unto ourselves, afraid of any human interaction. While I understand the need to be safe in a time of illness, I pray that, when the pandemic has settled, we return to being a community concerned for, and involved with, others.

If we want a model to follow in this regard, we need look no further than Jesus, who healed the man born blind, who ate with and forgave sinners, and touched the lepers to make them whole. It may be an uncertain time, but I am certain that the greater our trust in God's love, the more apt we are to make it through this challenge with hearts still committed to the care and support of others.

GUIDELINES FOR LENT

The time of Lent is to be observed by Catholics as a special season of prayer, penance, and works of charity.

*Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, in particular, are the most important penitential days of the liturgical year. They are days of both fast and abstinence. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.

*The rule of fasting states that only one full meal a day can be taken. Two small meals, "sufficient to maintain strength", are allowed, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals breaks the fast, but drinking liquids does not. The rule of fasting obliges all Catholics from 18 to 59.

*Abstinence refers to the eating of meat. The common estimation of the community is used to determine what falls under the category of meat. The rule of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years or older.

*The substantial observance of the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious obligation.

*Self-imposed fasting on the other weekdays of Lent is recommended. Abstinence on all Fridays of the year is also highly recommended.

*Parents and teachers should see to it that, even those who are not bound by the laws of fast and abstinence because of age, are brought up in an atmosphere that is conducive to a sense of penance.

FOR THE DIOCESE OF BURLINGTON

Precautionary notice from Bishop Christopher J. Coyne regarding novel coronavirus

As a precautionary measure to prevent the spread of viruses, such as the novel coronavirus and flu, Bishop Christopher J. Coyne released a notice to all parishes within the Diocese effective Wednesday, March 4, 2020, to temporarily suspend communion from the cup until further notice.

Additionally, until further notice, the Sign of Peace at Mass is not to include any physical contact. The practice of holding hands during the Lord's Prayer should cease as well.

Per the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommendations to limit potential exposure to viruses pastors have been asked to regularly communicate to their parishioners that if one is sick, he or she should stay home and not attend Mass. The obligation to attend Mass in such cases is lifted. Priests, lay ministers, and all present for liturgy should be mindful of and practice good hygiene measures.

It is important to note that many of the precautions that help prevent other respiratory diseases, like colds and the flu, can also help keep an illness like novel coronavirus from spreading:

- ✦ Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- ✦ Stay home (and keep your children home) when sick.
- ✦ Cover your cough or sneeze with your sleeve or a tissue. Throw the tissue in the trash.
- ✦ Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
